EMMA GOLDMAN IS AGAIN ARRESTED

San Francisco, Jan. 15.—While Emma Goldman, high priestess of anarchists, who was arrested here last night on a charge of conspiracy tending to incite a riot, was vainly striving to procure bail for her release from custody she received the sad news of the death of her father, Abraham Goldman, at Rochester, N. Y. She was much affected by the sad news.

Abraham Goldman was he proprietor of a small furniture store in had not connection with the activities of the anarchist society.

Emma Goldman, Ben L. Reitman, self-styled king of tramps, were arrested last night and held on eight

charges of conspiracy and held for bail of \$1000 for each charge. They were taken while on their way to the Victoria theater, where Miss Goldman was to have addressed a meeting. They were placed in a patrol wagon and taken to the prison. Fifty policemen had been placed about the theater prepared to suppress disorder.

William Buwalda, the soldier who was recently discharged from the federal prison after serving several months of a three-year sentence for appearing at an anarchist meeting in uniform, was loud in his denunciation at the arrest of Miss Goldman, and was himself taken into custody.

MORE THAN A HUNDRED RESCUED FROM MINE

(United Press Leased Wire.)

Vesserprim, Hungary, Jan. 15.—One hundred and fourteen men have been rescued from the Aucka coal mine, which was partially wrecked yesterday by a terrific explosion of fire damp and coal damp. Sixty-one bodies have thus far been removed from the workings. About 250 men

were entombed by the explosion, but as the fire had been confined to one gallery, it is expected that more of the miners will be rescued.

The rescuing parties worked all night and were rewarded with such success that today there is no cessation of their efforts to rescue as many of those remaining in the mine as possible.

TO DIVIDE STATE INTO LEGISLATIVE DISTRICTS

Mahone of Multnomah introduced in the house the proposed constitutional amendment prepared by the Republican club, of Portland, and providing for a division of the state into senatorial and representative districts.

The amendment contemplates that as soon as practicable after taking the next federal and state censuses, the legislative representation of the state shall be distributed on the basis of population, with the restriction that only one senator and one representative shall be apportioned to each senatorial and representative district.

The effect of this provision relating to the representation from the various districts as created, is effectively to combat the operation of the proportional representation scheme which was adopted by the people last June. The plan for the proportionate representation operate only in districts from which more than one senator or representative is elected. By establishing the boundaries of the different districts so that only one senator or one representative is to be elected from each, the election of legislators will continue as under the existing provisions of the constitution.

The proposed amendment provides that board, consisting of the governor, secretary of state and state treasurer, shall divide the state into the required districts and establish and designate the boundaries of those districts. Under the amendment it is provided that no district shall be created composed of territory partly in one county and partly in another.

SNOWS GOING OFF WITHOUT DAMAGE

On the level the snows have settled to about three inches, and a crust of ice on the snow holds the water down to the ground, and three-fourths of the melting snow is going into the soil. The river was down when the rains came, and the creeks were all low, so that as fast as they fill the water runs off, and there is but little danger of a flood. Unless the Santiam breaks over into Mill creek ditch there is not much chance of flooding the city from that source. At little snow is now melting in the mountains, whence the great floods come. The wind is a rainy breeze from the south, and not a Chinook wind, which comes from the southwest, caused by the Japanese current.

SACRED HEART TO HAVE ELECTRIC CROSS

An electric cross for St. Mary's Academy has been constructed by T. M. Barr, the plumber and metal worker. It is nearly completed and ready for erection. It will be about 16 feet high, and the arms are 10 feet across. It is of beautiful design, made on a wooden frame of galvanized iron, and wired for 12 electric lights, so that when erected it will be a beautiful illumination for the city. The cross complete and wired and painted will cost about \$175 to \$200, and the Mother Superior of Sacred Heart Academy has authorized the Capital Journal to receive contributions toward paying the expense of erecting this beautiful emblem of Christianity over a popular educational institution. Sacred Heart is a sectarian school for girls and young ladies, and is not conducted for profit, and has seldom asked any assistance of the people of Salem, while bringing many students and a great deal of money to our city. The Journal will be glad to acknowledge and forward any sums that its readers feel like contributing, and hopes there will be a quick and generous response. Mr. Barr has donated the metals entering into the construction of the cross.
