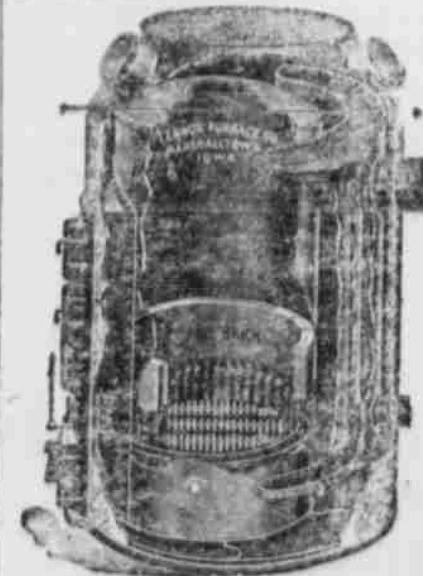

TREASURE SEEKING ENDS IN SUICIDE

(United Press Leased Wire.) Victoria, B. C., Jan. 16.—The Steamer Aorangi which has arrived from Australia, brings the news of a treasure hunt which ended in suicide. The schooner Wheatshaf had just arrived at Sydney when the Aorangi was about to sail. The schooner had returned from a hunt for a supposed fabulous treasure on an island in the Solomon group.

The Wheatshaf was dispatched by a syndicate formed there on an agreement whereby Mason, the organizer, agreed to have the captain, who 20 years before had aided a chief of Malaita to power and by cutting their arms and intermingling blood had become the chief's blood brother, direct the expedition to a large amount of gold discovered by the natives, and "in his capacity as a sovereign's blood brother secure sole right of trading throughout the country."

After cruising from a place in the Solomons, conferences being held with the native chiefs, the captain finally said his blood brother was blown up by dynamite in his absence and the expedition returned after depositing the captain and leaving him among the natives. Mason, the organizer, committed suicide on the way back to Sydney.
