No Danger of Flood—
The Willamette river was at a standstill all day yesterday, until near 8 o'clock in the evening, when it began to rise, and this morning the water gauge was covered up to the 12-foot mark, or a rise of just six feet in 10 hours. Owing to the big stream being so late in showing the effects of the thaw and rain, a high water is not expected by the river men, but 15 or 17 feet will probably be reached before it starts down again. The most angry river in the country is the Santiam. That sometimes little river is a boiling torrent at present, but has done no damage as far as can be learned.

Another Development Club—
At a meeting of the East Salem Development Club last evening, the following officers were elected and a permanent organization effected: President, John Knight; vice-president, C. W. Eppley; secretary, A. M. Dalrymple; treasurer, H. N. Goode. The meeting was held in the Nineteenth Congregational church, and about 50 people were in attendance. The aim of this organization is to improve the streets and sidewalks in that district, which takes in that part of the city east of Fourteenth street and south of Asylum avenue to the Turner road.

Bridge Out At Reform School—
Word was received from the Reform school this morning, that the bridge near the depot at that place went out last night. The creek at that point was a raging torrent early today, and this in connection with the ice flow swept away about 150 feet of the structure. The traveling public going to and from the school are unable to board the train at the school station now.

Took a Cold Bath—
While attempting to remove a jam of ice and snow from the Mill creek dam in East Salem, yesterday afternoon, Harry Lamar, a well-known Salem man, was struck behind the ear with a pike pole, and knocked into the water below the dam. Harry, in explaining the accident, could not tell just how he found himself sailing through the air for the high dive, but said the first information which came to him, was that in the attempt to pry a large cake of ice away from the dam wall proper, the pole slipped and his weight forced it under another cake which turned over sharply and struck the pole a hard lick throwing it over his head and throwing him in turn over the dam into about seven feet of ice cold water. Outside of a thorough wetting, no damage was done.
