FAMILY
FOUND
DEAD

(United Press Leased Wire.)

Seattle, Wash., Jan. 18.—Kneeling side by side in front of a bath tub at their home, with their heads submerged in the water that filled the tub, the bodies of W. L. Seeley, an attorney, and former national bank examiner, his wife, Mrs. Kate M. Seeley, and their daughter, Miss Rene Seeley, recently a student at the University of Washington, were found yesterday morning. They had not been seen since Thursday, and the ghastly discovery was made by Guy M. Smelser, an employee of the Lowman & Hanford Stationery and Printing Company, and the affianced husband of Miss Seeley, and E. W. Seibell, a friend of the Seeley family for 12 years. The women had been murdered. On their heads were visible the marks of some heavy, blunt instrument, such as a hammer, with which their lives had been crushed out. It is the coroner's theory that Seeley came to his death by drowning in the bath tub. There is no mark of violence on his body. Not an article of value in the house so far as known is missing; apparently nothing had been disturbed. All the doors and windows were fast. These facts, the police believe, discredit the theory of a triple murder for robbery by a fourth party. It is the theory of Coroner J. C. Snyder and the police that, Seeley, driven insane by worry over financial troubles, murdered his wife and daughter and took his own life. The instrument with which the women were killed, however, is missing.

Worried because of the non-appearance of any member of the family during Friday and Saturday, and unable to explain their disappearance, Smelser and Seibell forced their way into the house, where they came upon the three kneeling corpses.

The crime is believed by the police and the coroner to have been committed Thursday night. Nothing has been seen of any member of the family since that time. Guy M. Smelser was the last person who is known to have held any communication with any of the Seeley family. At 9 o'clock Thursday morning he spoke to Miss Seeley, his fiancée, on the telephone. They spoke of their plans to go to a party the following night at a friend's house. Smelser called up the residence again, but received no answer.

He tried twice to catch them on the wire, but failed. Finally he ascertained from the telephone company that the line was in order, and concluded that the members of the family were away for a short time.

RIVER WILL NOT REACH
THE DANGER STAGE

Unless there should be a continuous heavy rain fall of four or more days' duration above this city, the Willamette river will not do any damage around Salem. Reports from Albany and Eugene are to the effect the snow has all disappeared, and the river has no feeder of any importance on the south of the mouth of the Santiam.

The river register at this point showed 18 feet at 9 o'clock this morning, having raised one foot and a half last night. The present raise is slow but steady, and the O. C. T. Co., is moving all their destructible goods to safety, out of the warehouse, as the water is expected to reach at least 20 feet before it begins to fall. The Oregon Transportation's steamer Pomona is tied up on this side of the steel bridge unable to pass under it on account of the high water. Owing to the many reports of coming danger of high water during the snow storm, farmers and residents who have land and stock situated along the banks between here and Independence, have removed their belongings to a safer distance. A wise precaution, but there was no real danger.

The Santiam river near Sidney has not shown any indication of breaking previous records, although it is up to a good stage now.
