MADE A BOLD BREAK FOR HIS LIBERTY

(United Press Leased Wire.)

Tacoma, Wash., Jan. 23.—Walter H. Lawrence, 19 years of age, made a sensational break for liberty yesterday following his release from the federal penitentiary at McNeil's Island and rearrest by detectives from Covington, Ky., on a charge of attempted murder.

Lawrence was on his way to the steamer dock in Tacoma, in charge of United States Deputy Marshal Statter, and, while crossing the railroad tracks, suddenly slipped one of his handcuffs and started on a run down the tracks. The officer and a number of railroad employees gave pursuit, and an exciting chase ensued, several shots being fired. Lawrence was finally overtaken and re-shackled. Later he was turned over to a detective from Covington.

Lawrence and Frank Johnson robbed a sub-postal station at Portland, Or., March 23, 1908. Their sentence was reduced by good behavior, and yesterday they were released from McNeil's Island.

ISLANDS SUBMERGED AND DANGER GROWING

Sacramento, Cal., Jan. 23.—Twitchell Island is inundated and other islands at the junction of the Sacramento and San Joaquin rivers are slightly flooded where the water is under the pressure of a high southwest wind, which fans the waves over the levee tops. Lower Sherman and Venice Island are submerged and the levees are weakening under the continued pounding of the water. Rio Vista Island is inundated and household goods have been removed to the second floors of dwellings. The water is still rising at this point. The San Joaquin delta is safe as long as the Bannan levee holds, but this levee may go out at any moment, as it has been greatly weakened by the floods of the past week.

MAY BUILD FIVE-STORY BRICK IN THE SPRING

Although unprepared as yet to give out any information of a definite character, the officials of the United States National Bank in this city, are intending to erect a five-story brick office building on the old Moore property on State street west of the Red Cross Pharmacy.

The promoters of the new building, as proposed, are unable to confirm any matters relating to the erection as yet, and stated this morning that, notwithstanding there was ground for the rumor circulating to that effect, they would not be responsible for any statements made leading anyone to believe the construction of the building was a settled fact. The work on the structure, if decided on, will be commenced early next spring.

The land, upon which now stands several old buildings, was one of the first spots built on in Salem. Back in the 60c one of the first postoffice headquarters was situated in the old building, across the street from the Board of Trade rooms. The old land marks are now being torn down, and several of the timbers which made up the frame of the structure consist of logs hewn out and put together in the manner in which such work was done long ago. Many of Salem's pioneers can remember the time when they passed through the small door formerly in the front of the building and received their daily mail.

SNOW IN COLORADO DOES MUCH DAMAGE

Grand Junction, Col., Jan. 23.—

Under an avalanche of snow four men were killed today and more than a score nearly escaped death in a similar manner. Snow is sweeping the Camp Bird mine at Ouray, where the deaths occurred and 40 horses are buried under tons of it near here.

Emil Johnson, one of the miners, after being buried, was dug out by his dog. Eight six-horse teams drawing many passengers in stages have been caught in the mountains by the avalanche.

TO CREATE A CITY BOARD OF CHARITIES

At the instance of the Ministerial Union of Salem, a meeting was held last night, which will bring forth a board of charities for this city. A committee, composed by the clerical body met at the Salem Board of Trade rooms, and besides Mayor Rodgers, several ministers and business men were present. Rev. Bandy acted as chairman of the meeting.

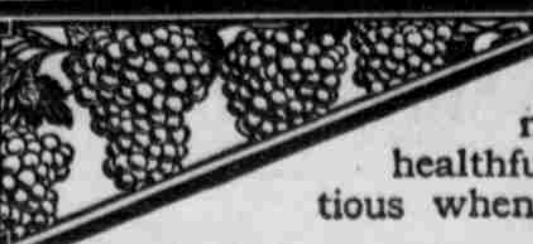
Several instances of need, as a result of the recent cold snap, were spoken of, and various means of assisting this class of people were discussed. Salem has not had a board of charities for many years and there would probably have been no occasion at this time for consideration of this business, except for the recent cold spell, which has found many of the poorer people wholly unprepared.

Mayor Rodgers spoke of several cases of attempted imposition, and thought the matter should be judiciously handled. Mr. Huckestein and others spoke of the situation, and felt that Salem should make arrangements to prevent suffering. Mayor Rodgers and County Judge Bushey were asked to name a board consisting of one member from each ward, to whom applications could be referred, and whose business would be to recommend assistance where actually needed. This motion was unanimously carried, and the county and city authorities will no doubt announce their appointments at an early date.

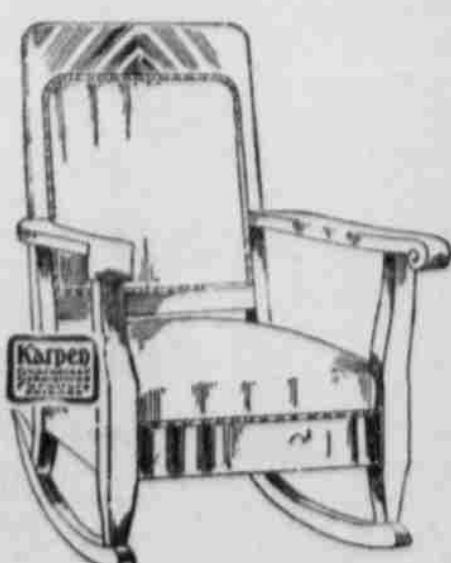
