Retail tradesmen have themselves miscalculated the great purchasing power of the people, and stocks have been in many cases sold out long before the demand ceased. Employees are sharing the prosperity with their employers, and are receiving bonuses of 10 to 50 per cent of their wages. Protection spells all-round good times. A contemporary has reported that this Christmas in Germany is the leanest for many years. Our Berlin correspondent has investigated the allegation, and finds that it is quite unfounded. The Christmas sales show an advance of from 10 to 15 per cent over those of last year. The only falling off is in the sales of cheap and inferior goods. The German people are prosperous and are able to buy the best. Protection again spells all-round good times.

So much for protected Germany and America. What of free trade Great Britain? The Cobdenites points to the crowded shops and say with Mr. Squeers, "There's richness." But the shops are largely crowded with purchasers forced by exigent purses to search for cheap bargains, and of these cheap Christmas presents a large proportion is made abroad. The ability of the German father to buy his children costly gifts is largely owing to the English father being obliged to buy his children cheap German gifts. While our

shops are crowded, our streets are filled with the wailing of the unemployed. The comparatively prosperous Englishman must look at every penny. He can barely afford necessities. Luxuries are outside his power altogether. The very rich are feeling the Cobdenite-cum-Socialist pinch least of all because they are investing their money abroad. It is the working and the poorer middle classes that are ruined by foreign cheap labor and the Socialistic threats of radical statesmen.—London Express

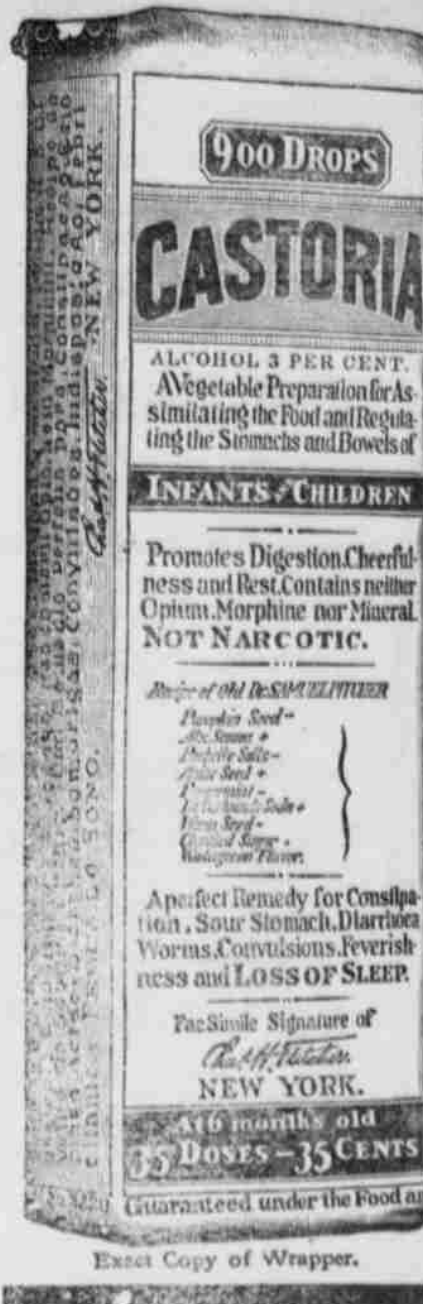
