When the runaway rig passed in front of the Barnes store someone rushed out and gave them another scare, and they ran headlong into the blacksmith shop, breaking themselves away from the wagon without injuring either harness or horses, and only leaving the wagon without a tongue, and, therefore speechless.

CRITICIZE HIM FIRST, BEAT HIM AFTERWARD

New York, Jan. 25.—A little encounter between newspaper reporters and Oscar Hammerstein, manager of the Manhattan opera house, which began in the lobby of the Knickerbocker hotel, was resumed today in the street in front of the Jefferson market police court and in the court room itself. The two reporters were going to the court room where they had been summoned on a complaint made by Mr. Hammerstein. The hearing was postponed and Hammerstein and the two reporters were arraigned for fighting in and about the court room. As no damage had been done the magistrate dismissed this complaint. Hammerstein and the critics met last night in the Knickerbocker hotel and after expressing their opinions of each other, proceeded to mix it. The police interfered and the combatants were taken to the courtroom. Here even a more strenuous encounter took place in which Hammerstein was knocked over a bench. He was picked up by his son apparently uninjured.

PROHIS SAY THAT UTAH WILL BE DRY

Salt Lake City, Utah, Jan. 25.—State wide prohibition is in store for Utah if a measure drawn up by the Anti-Saloon league and now before the general assembly, is favorably acted upon by the legislators. The bill is extremely drastic as under its provisions, the manufacture, sale or free dispensing of intoxicants are strictly prohibited. Even from the druggist liquor cannot be obtained unless a special prescription is written and filed with the county clerk. The anti-saloon forces declare that they have the promises of two-thirds of the members of the house that the bill will pass.

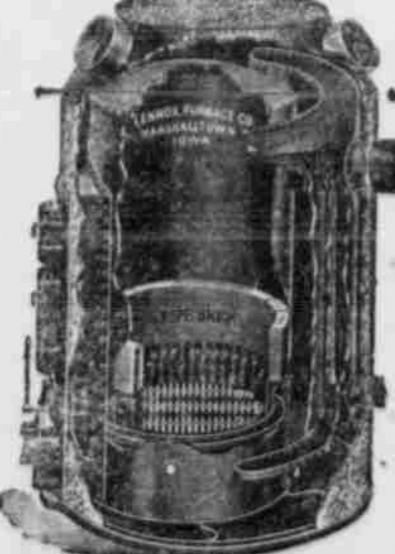
