

HERE IS A POINTER
ON CHINESE LAUNDRIES

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Chicago, Jan. 27.—The board of health is preparing plans today for a campaign of criminal procedure against Chinese laundries, where the Orientals sprinkle clothing with water from their mouths, preparatory to the ironing process.

The case was started when news came from Patterson, N. J., that a man had contracted leprosy from germs which lodged in clothing sent back from a Chinese laundry where it had been mouth-sprinkled.

A thorough examination of Chinese laundries will be made and ordinances will be framed prohibiting the sprinkling of clothing by mouth.

OREGON EXPRESS
BADLY WRECKED

Cheyenne, Wyo., Jan. 27.—Nine persons injured in a wreck of the Oregon express of the Union Pacific Railway yesterday afternoon at Dana 150 miles west of here, were brought to hospitals here today. Miss Emma Cingiput, of Danbury, Iowa, en route to Caldwell, Idaho, was killed in the accident.

The wreck was caused by a broken rail which precipitated five cars into a ditch beside the track and derailed four others.

MAY RECOMMEND JAPS
FOR CITIZENSHIP

Sacramento, Jan. 27.—Believing that if the laws discriminating against the Japanese are passed by the legislature, President Roosevelt will send a special message to congress requesting that the subjects of the Ikado be given the privilege of American citizenship, Senator J. B. Sanford has decided to drop all future efforts to bring about the passage of anti-alien bills. He will drop his own measure which would prevent an alien, "not a citizen of the United States" from owning land and real estate.

There are other similar bills, however.

Tokio, Jan. 27.—Government commissioners reporting on Japanese emigrants throughout the world today announced that settlers in North America have families in most instances and their condition is very satisfactory. The condition of Japanese in Peru and Brazil is uncertain as yet, but the future is promising in South America over improvement in agricultural and industrial enterprises.
