

FIGHT FOR BETTER
NAVAL STATIONS

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Washington, Jan. 28.—A vigorous and united campaign on the part of the representatives of California, Oregon and Washington for large appropriations for better naval stations on the Pacific coast was decided on today by congressmen and senators from the coast.

A gigantic naval station on San Francisco bay, with repair shops, improvement of the yards at Mare Island and Bremerton and the establishment of a supply depot at San Pedro are the main features. Incidentally a movement to increase the size of the fleet in the Pacific ocean will be undertaken.

The greatest improvement is planned for San Francisco bay, which the delegation will urge, shall be placed in such a condition that a fleet of any size can be adequately taken care of.

FELL 100 FEET BUT
