KILLING MEN BY MISTAKE NOT A CRIME

SENATE KILLS KAY'S BILL TO CONVICT CRIMINALS, AND HOLDS UP TAX LEVY

In the senate the bill by Abraham was defeated, to make it manslaughter to kill a man by mistake while hunting. It was ably debated and by many considered one of the best bills of the senate, as it is the opinion of old hunters that such homicides are entirely inexcusable. Kay's bill to provide for trial on original indictment, where a new trial is granted, was also killed on a close vote.

State Tax Levy.

The house promptly rushed

through the bill to authorize a state tax levy this morning, under the leadership of the Marion county delegation. It went to the senate, and was presented and put to third reading by Senator Bingham. Smith, of Marion, then joined Nottingham for dilatory tactics, and the matter was pending when the house adjourned to 2 o'clock this afternoon. Beach of Portland also pleaded for immediate consideration.

At 2 o'clock the tax matter was again taken up and made the special order for 3:30 this afternoon.

TRAIN ROBBER GETS A LIFE SENTENCE

(United Press Leased Wire.) Helena, Mont., Jan. 28.—George Frankhauser, convicted on a charge of holding up a Great Northern train a year ago, placing the life of the custodian of the mails in jeopardy and stealing \$40,000 from the registered mail, must spend the rest of his natural life in the federal prison at Fort Leavenworth.

Judge Hunt of the federal court today imposed this severe sentence, principally because, in robbing the mail car, the prisoner endangered the life of the man who had charge of the mail pouches. It is understood that Frankhauser has made a clean breast of the robbery, and that his confession will soon be published.

KLEIN HAS SYSTEM THAT BEATS WIRELESS

Tacoma, Wash., Jan. 28.—Sitting behind the bars of his cell in the county jail today, Joshua Klein, who it is claimed, is holding Miss Rose Karasek and Miss Dora Sauvageot, prominent in Tacoma, under a mysterious spell in Europe received a "thought message" from Herr Prett, a member of the queer cult of which Klein is leader.

"Have you sent for Rose and Dora?" asked the alleged spirit message. "No, decidedly not," Klein said he replied.

To a newspaper reporter today Klein attempted to explain the intricacies of his alleged power.

"It is true," he said, "that I can send and receive messages from those who have studied my belief. From the fact that Herr Prett communicated with me, I believe that Mrs. Sauvageot sent a cablegram, singing my name, and demanding that the young ladies return to America. They will not come, however, as long as Herr Prett is near them."

Continuing, Klein said: "Miss Sauvageot and Miss Karasek are at liberty to come home if they wish but they have entered so deeply into the study of my belief that they have even given up the study of music in order to learn more of the 'true life.'"

Klein denied that the girls are held against their will. He admitted that Miss Sauvageot is at present in a cottage belonging to him in the Swiss Alps and that Miss Karasek is in Vienna but said that their absence from home is entirely voluntary.

In relation to the cult which he originated, Klein says:

"This belief is more than that of mind over matter; it is the higher impulse offered by will over mind. It is not a religion; it is not a form of hypnotism nor a magical fancy, as some have hinted. It is a compilation of facts—spiritual, mental and physical.

An information charging Klein with attempted murder will be filed by the prosecuting attorney probably tomorrow and Klein's arraignment will be before the superior court.

MURDER MYSTERY IN CALIFORNIA

South San Francisco, Cal., Jan. 28.—The San Mateo county authorities are investigating the mystery surrounding the murder of an unidentified man found in the marshes near here yesterday afternoon. The body was badly decomposed, and, from appearances, met death three weeks ago.

The sheriff's deputies believe that he was first shot in the back of the head. When found there was a bullet hole at the base of the skull, a bullet wound in the wrist and the man's throat was cut almost to the vertebra.

Little was found to furnish a clue save an eyeglass, showing the maker as "M. J. Cheney," Topeka, Kansas.
