### FORTY-SEVEN DROWNED ON SINKING STEAMER

[United Press Leased Wire.]  
Melbourne, Feb. 1.—Carrying her captain and 46 members of her crew to the bottom of the sea, the British steamer Clan Ranald sank last night before rescuers could reach the spot. Only 18 of the crew were able to escape in lifeboats.

The vessel was sighted drifting ashore, but by the time those on land realized that she was in distress it was too late to save all aboard. Desperate attempts were made to snatch from the sinking steamer the 47 who perished. The boat went down off Edithburg.

Chemawa Teams Win—  
Both the girls' and the boys' basketball teams of the Chemawa school won a victory over the respective teams from Albany yesterday. The two girl teams gave a fine exhibition of basketball, the Chemawa team carrying away the contest with a score of 8 to 5, and the boys 11 to 10 in favor of the Indians. The boys' game made the many spectators set up and look interested throughout, as they played the limit from the first blow of the whistle.

### Teachers' Institute

Twenty teachers attended the first series of Teachers' Institutes held at Turner Saturday, and the program arranged by Superintendent of County Schools Wm. Smith, was carried out. The greater part of the forenoon was taken up with discussions relative to the school management. Miss Lizzie Cornelius delivered an interesting talk on this subject. The afternoon program was opened by the Turner Brass band, which gave several selections. The subject of arithmetic was introduced by U. S. Dotson, of Marion, followed by E. C. Armstrong, who addressed the teachers on the subject of agriculture. Mr. Armstrong gave an excellent demonstration along the line of grafting trees and other methods valuable to the fruit and farming public.

### The Courthouse Clock

The officials have been informed that it would cost the county \$65 per month to keep 48 lights burning on the face of the time piece, which is considered a little steep by the county court.

A writ of review has been filed in the circuit court by the tax payers of the Silverton road district in an attempt to settle the difficulty which has been before the county commissioners for past few weeks. 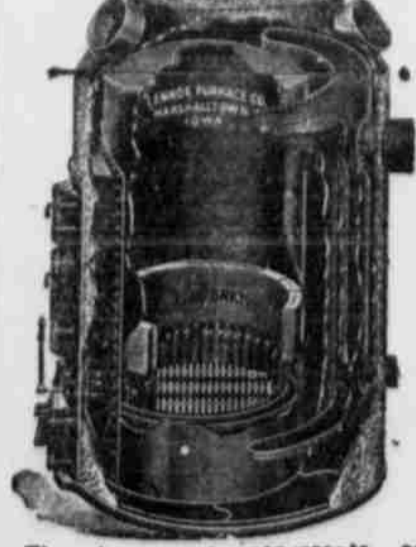
