MOROS OBJECT TO BENEVOLENT ASSIMILATION

PAY \$350 FOR CHEAP RIFLES TO CONTINUE THEIR FIGHT FOR LIBERTY

Manila, P. I., Feb. 1.—Three gunboats left today for the island of Jolo, which is inhabited by the fierce Moros as the result of a report that two thousand rifles have been smuggled into the island from the Dutch East Indies.

If the Moros have two thousand rifles the situation is the most serious since the fighting began several years ago. At the time of General Wood's famous fight, there were only four hundred rifles on the whole island.

Since then the American troops have been fighting continuously, capturing the rifles one by one and with great difficulty. When one Moro falls with his gun, another of the tribesmen spring forward, seizes the gun and escapes.

With 2000 rifles the Moros will give the troops the most difficult and dangerous opposition yet encountered.

The Moros pay \$350 for a \$12 rifle and 50 cents each for cartridges, so the Dutch traders find the smuggling profitable and worth the risk involved.

It is also reported that a large quantity of opium has been smuggled into Jolo. It is believed this is part of a new scheme to bring opium into Manila by secretly bringing it up the coast.

Americans in the Philippines.

Manila, P. I., Feb. 1.—Great delight is being expressed today by all the Americans here over Governor Smith's strong message to the second session of the Philippine assembly, which convened today.

The message is looked upon as an ultimatum from Washington that the native statesmen must "be good" or they will feel the authority of the American government.

The Americans here supported

Taft's candidacy with the understanding that there would be a change of policy in the islands following his election, and today they are celebrating the accomplishment of the change.

Since the first session of the native assembly, the chief act of which was to declare for immediate independence, the white people here have been humiliated by Filipino statesmen.

The native leaders have been arrogant, insulting and seditious. They have been overpowered by egotism as the result of the authority placed in them. This state of affairs has not only made it unpleasant for Americans but has retarded commercial development.

Governor Smith's plan contained in his message is believed to mark the beginning of a revival of prosperity in the islands.

The incompetence of the native police is noted on a recent tour of five cities, Governor Smith found that the rifles supposed to be used by the police were stacked in an unguarded room in the municipal building and the police were enjoying themselves, at their leisure, in whatever manner suited them.

Every band of Ladrone, the bandits, against which the military has been operating for six months, has been armed with rifles taken from municipal police.

The local government of Manila, a joint American and native organization, is considered highly incompetent, though no serious charges of corruption have been made.

The failure of the native police and the incompetency of the local government here, leads to the expectation that both the city government and the government of the provinces soon will be in the hands of Americans.

AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE MAKES SPLENDID SHOWING

LEGISLATIVE AND OTHER VISITORS ARE LIKE MISSOURIANS, "SHOWN"

Saturday last the members of the state legislature and their friends took the Oregon Agricultural college by storm, and were splendidly received. The weather was fine and everything co-operated to make the day one to be long remembered. The visiting body was met on its arrival by the members of the faculty, who escorted them to the grounds, where the cadets, a regiment of over 800, paraded in review in honor of the occasion. The army was then visited where the cadets went through a drill, in which they showed such precision that they elicited great applause from the gallery.

It was here the inadequacy of the building to care for the great cadet body was immediately apparent. The drill of the cadets was followed by a physical culture drill by the young ladies, who, like the cadets, were enthusiastically applauded.

The president of the board of regents then made an address of welcome, and briefly referred to the work done by the college, and warmly commended the administration of the same. Speaker McArthur was then introduced, and he was keenly listened to as he gave the assurance, speaking on behalf of the legislators, that everything in their power would be done to meet the needs of the college.

Senator Kay next spoke eloquently in the same strain, saying that he recognized the need of the extension of building. After this Waldo Hall was invaded, where a delightful and satisfying luncheon was served. The young ladies served at the long rows of tables, decorated with white pink and red carnations. Everything was done with a precision and artisticness

that gave the whole an irresistible glamour. After the menu, which consisted of oyster cocktail, bouillon, halibut saute, sauce Mayonnaise, roast chicken, fruit salad and coffee.

Pres. Weatherford acted as toast master and again called on Speaker McArthur, who this time spoke upon the value of industrial education, the gist of his remarks being that we must begin at the bottom and develop along practical lines, toward the end of efficient and practical, rather than theoretical training.

Next Senator Albee heartily commended the work of the college.

Representative Mahoney and Senator Oliver both expressed their belief in the value of the education offered by the college. Senator Oliver expressed himself as being especially appreciative of industrial and scientific education and training, believing that in this lies the potentiality that will magnify Oregon. Buchanan also spoke, Senators Chase and Abraham also were convinced that everything reasonable asked for by the college could not and should not be withheld, considering the showing which had been made.

President Kerr then thanked all present for the courtesy extended the college by the visitors.

After renditions by the college quartette which were greeted with much applause, the visitors wended their way to the buildings.

And here was certainly ample evidence of the value of industrial training, an also the efficiency of the organization which so well and economically knew how to use its space to the best advantage.

The system of operation in the wood working room is as perfect as it can be made. Here the student learns the use and care of his tools, the use of machinery, the circular and band saws, turning lathes, mortising machines and all that makes the full equipment of a mill outfit. Besides this and in the same large room are the drafting benches, next

to the woodworking benches. The show cases show the products in joinery from simple lap joints to the most involved and essential forms of splicing lumber. The machine and iron working room is not less interesting and complete. It was a convincing sight to see the cadets at the anvils and in nearby heaps the welded chains and other implements of service in agriculture—carefully and efficiently made. But lack of time permitted no further examination. And as the party returned to the cars and amid the college cries of the cadets, steamed back toward Salem, everyone agreed that it had been a day long to be remembered, one of pleasant surprises and one above all of assurance that in Oregon is a college fathered by the state which was able to give its youth the training that would fit them for all emergencies and conditions of life, and that would yield its harvest an hundred fold in a well disciplined and moral womanhood and manhood, for the glory of Oregon and the development of its waiting resources.
