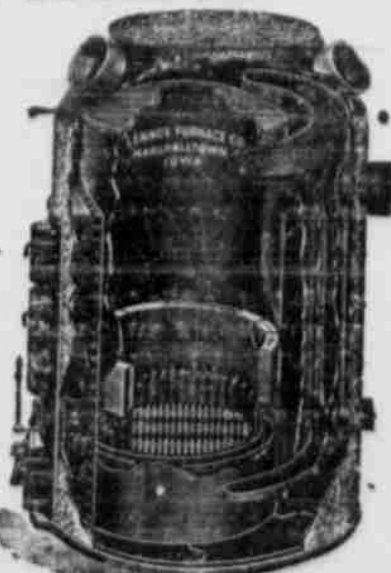

ROUTINE WORK IN LEGISLATURE

House Monday Afternoon.
H. B. No. 107, Brook, to make it a misdemeanor to take Statement No. 1. Special order Wednesday at 2 p. m.

H. B. No. 24, Purdin, salary court judge of Jackson county, \$1800. Instead of \$2500, as introduced. Passed.

H. B. No. 80, Calkins, relating to forming new school districts. Put limit at 15, while present is six children. Failed to pass.

H. B. 51, McCue, to permit counties to levy tax for advertising purposes. Passed.

H. B. 65, Buchanan, prohibiting wearing military or naval uniform, and making same a misdemeanor. Passed.

H. B. 134, Calkins, relating to filing suits in Lis Pendens affecting real property. Passed.

H. B. 150, Eastern Oregon delegation, for general bounty act, to ways and means committee.

H. B. 110, Bedillion, relating to deputies to assessor of Coos county. Passed.

H. B. 93, Campbell, request, to amend attachment law. Once passed and reconsidered. Failed to pass.

Adjourned to 9:30 a. m. Tuesday. Senate, Monday Afternoon.

Called to order at 2 p. m. The first order of business was reports of standing committees which occupied considerable time. The judiciary committee submitted a minority report on Senator Abraham's bill abolishing non-suits in certain cases and the adoption of the report produced considerable argument; the majority to indefinitely postpone was adopted by a vote of 17 to 13.

S. B. 165, Albee, relating to dangerous weapons.

S. B. 166, Bowerman, relating to district courts.

S. B. 167, Kay, relating to insurance companies.

S. B. 168, Abraham, authorizing the state to relinquish claims to certain lands.

S. B. 169, Miller of Linn and Lane, to allow counties to construct railroad to transport road materials.

S. B. 170, Sinnott, to amend code so that marriage will establish age of majority.

S. B. 171, Bailey, relating to corporations.

S. B. 172, Kellaher, relating to switches at connections of lateral railroads.

S. B. 173, Nottingham, relating to false representation in fraternal and other organizations.

S. B. 174, Kay, relating to optometry.

S. B. 175, Bingham, relating to water power rights.

S. B. 176, Albee, relating to street railways.

S. B. 177, Selling, relating to sailor boarding houses.

All bills on table were read the second time and referred to appropriate committees.

Third Reading Bills.
S. B. 68, Committee on Penal Institutions. To prevent procreation in confirmed criminals, insane persons, idiots, imbeciles and rapists, Dr. Owen-Adair bill. Passed, 20 voting therefor.

S. B. 127, Miller of Linn and Lane, for a free ferry across Willamette in Linn county. Passed.

S. B. 159, Committee on Education, to require the teaching of Oregon history in the schools of the state. Re-referred.

Adjourned at 4 o'clock until 10 Tuesday.
