MANY KILLED IN A LODGING HOUSE FIRE

Manchester, England, Feb. 8.—Ten men are known to be dead, and others are probably buried in the ruins of a Grosvenor street lodging house where 300 men were trapped by a fire that destroyed the structure early this morning. A dozen were seriously injured and two scores slightly hurt in the wild panic to escape. The lodgers were asleep, when the flames suddenly swept through the corridors. A terrific panic followed, in which men fought with each other like demons to reach the windows and stairs. Scores jumped from the windows and from the roof. Most of the dead were killed by breaking their skulls by leaping or being trampled to death in the stampede.

Twenty or thirty are missing, and it is almost impossible to get any accurate account of those who were in the lodgings.

The house was consumed in an hour, and is now a smouldering ruin. Most of the men were poor laborers, and nearly all of them lost all their clothes and whatever belongings they had.
