### FIVE BILLS THAT SHOULD BE PUT THROUGH AT THIS SESSION OF THE LEGISLA-TURE IN THE CAUSE OF PRUGRESS AND TO BUILD A GREATER OREGON.

SOME OF THE BILLS THAT REPRESENT THE PROGRAM FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A GREATER OREGON.

THE BEAN BILL THAT CREATES A GENERAL PORT COMMISSION ACT.

(Has passed the House.)

THE JONES BILL FOR FREE LOCKS AND CANAL AT OREGON CITY.

(Has passed the House.)

THE BILL APPROPRIATING \$100,000 FOR THE CRATER LAKE ROAD. (Has passed both houses.)

THE BILL TO BUILD STATE-AIDED RAILROADS. (Introduced by Speaker McArthur.)

\*THE CONSITUTIONAL AMENDMENT FOR SAME PURPOSE.

(To be submitted to vote of the people.)

#### THE NORMAL SCHOOL ISSUE.

The normal school question before the legislature is narrowed down to the bill of Senator Smith of Marion county for one school, or the McCue bill for three:

The one large central school is a beautiful theory but it has

no educational value.

One central normal school means to abandon the three schools the state already has, with property, buildings and equipment WORTH A QUARTER OF A MILLION DOLLARS.

It means to spend as much more—three times as much as it takes to run the three schools at present, or a state debit of a half million.

The best authorities agree that small normal schools with not over 300 students produce THE BEST RESULTS FROM A PEDAGOGIC STANDPOINT.

In such normal schools all students come in personal contact with the faculty and get experience in the training department impossible in larger schools.

THERE IS NOT A SINGLE SOUND ARGUMENT NI FAVOR OF ONE LARGE CENTRAL STATE NORMAL SCHOOL.

It is a system that other states are trying to get away

The three schools in Oregon are now 250 miles apart and geographically located TO ACCOMMODATE THE LARGEST NUMBER OF PUPILS.

The expense is reduced to a minimum with three schools under one board, with a uniform course of study and everything cut out of their courses of study but PREPARATION OF

TEACHERS FOR THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS. A limited number of normal schools economically conducted and given a reasonable support is the right policy for the

LUTIN EDUCATIONAL IMPERIALISM.

The time has come to quit tearing down and destroying anything we have in Oregon that is of value, that is producing good results, and BUILD UP AFFIRMATIVELY THE IN-STITUTIONS WE HAVE.

#### THE BUCHANAN COUNTY SALARY BILL.

ary-grabbing itch, get the virus in their blood, and the legislature is swamped with bills.

One distinguished senator has been SO BESEIGED HE HAS INTRODUCED ALMOST NO OTHER BILLS.

But we do not believe the Buchanan bill would accomplish a reform of this abuse as is intended.

IT BASES SALARIES ON POPULATION ALONE WHICH IS NOT RIGHT. A county with 10,000 people may have only one-fourth

the area of another county of the same population. We believe the bill would be better if it fixed the salary of each county judge and the per diem of the commission-

ers and allowed the county commissioners' court of each county to FIX THE SALARIES OF ALL THE OTHER COUNTY OFFICIALS AND THEIR DEPUTIES, SUBJECT TO A COUNTY REFERENDUM.

That has been the general practice of nearly all the bestgoverned states in the Union.

The great differences in population area climate, geography and topography of the different counties, makes it almost IMPOSSIBLE TO DEAL WITH THIS PROBLEM BY A BLANKET BILL.

Hence, the more we can leave to the people of the several counties the adjustment of these differences, the more satisfactory would be the result.
