**OREGON MEN FOR GOVERNOR**  
**ONE MAN WHO IS NOT RUNNING**

The Spectator, a "journal of progress" at Portland, which seems to be a non-political paper read at the hotels and clubs and sold at all the news stands, has the following article on the alleged candidates for governor. The Capital Journal prints the article for information, but wishes to state at the very start that the editor of this paper is not a candidate and will not make himself a candidate for any office. Under the direct primary, law the people have a perfect right to make any man a candidate, and to defeat any man who gets a nomination if they do not want him. The shackles of machine politics have been broken in Oregon and there is no intention on the part of this newspaper to restore the old convention system or in any way interfere with the people in selecting the standard bearers of any party or of defeating any man that any party puts up who is not satisfactory to the people. Here is the article:

**"The Right Men for Governor.**  
"The state is abloom with gubernatorial flowers. Gubernatorial bees are buzzing in every field. Not to strain simile too far, it may be said that the amount of gubernatorial timber still standing in Oregon will outlast the demand by some thousands of years. This is most encouraging; the reports of scientists on the timber supply had begun to depress us. There are six anxious and avid and as many receptive candidates for the Republican nomination. This proves that while republicans are ungrateful, Republicans are not backward. Colonel E. Hofer, stalwart editor, and statesman, of Salem, is one of the aspirants. Colonel Hofer was recently elected to the council of the capital city by a big majority, despite his declination to run. The particular plank on which he will stand in his fight for the governorship is "anti-machine." Good enough, too, when the platforms of so many of us may be succinctly written, "We want the office." Colonel Hofer has many friends, both editors and subscribers, and as he has a carefully cultivated vocabulary, and considerable steam, he will be heard from from now on.

District Attorney George J. Cameron, with his Glengarry regally cocked over one eye, has the other optic coquettishly fixed on the gubernatorial chair. George made such a popular municipal judge that the people made him district attorney; as the paths of this office often lead to the governor's office, Judge Cameron is getting ready to tread them.

Grant B. Dimick is not very busy just now, and has time to send out some very pleasant stories of his candidacy. The Oregon City papers speak very highly of Mr. Dimick, and assure us that he will make a splendid governor, one who is not tied up to any faction, and one who will represent all the people. That's the kind we want.

"James Witnycombe of Corvallis will run again, at the earnest solicitation of many friends, who insist that he will be the people's governor, will represent all the people, and will not tie up with any faction. We want that kind of a governor.

"On behalf of J. W. Bailey, his record as food commissioner is pointed to, and it really seems all right. It is said of Mr. Bailey that he is not connected with any faction and that he will be the people's governor. A governor of that kind is what the people are looking for.

"School Superintendent Ackerman stands on his record as an educator, which is very good. His friends say he deserves the office because he is with the people on all public questions, and for the further reason that he is not the creature of any faction. The people are looking for that sort of a governor.

"Frank Benson, the efficient Secretary of State, who will be governor as soon as Governor Chamberlain takes his seat in the United States senate, is likely to be coaxed into the race by his friends, who show his excellent record as a public official. On his behalf they say he will not be the representative of any faction, but will make a people's governor. It seems to me that a man running on that platform would have a good chance, as the people are looking for just that kind of a governor. A number of other prominent gentlemen will be pleased to accept the nomination, and have promised to hold aloof from all factional interests and fights, and represent only the people. They certainly have a good platform, as the people are determined to elect the kind of governor they describe."
