FREE LOCKES BILL THRO SENATE MEASURE EXTENDED

The Senate last night passed the bill extending act of 1907 appropriating \$300,000 for the purchase of the Locks and Canal at Oregon City four years, as amended in the Ways and Means committee. The time was extended from two years to four years and the money already collected under the act made available for the general fund, but authorizing new levies of \$100,000 per year. The state board is empowered to draw a warrant of the full amount whenever congress passes the bill to take over and maintain the locks and canal free to the people. The bill passed by the Senate is the Ways and Means committee substitute for the Jones' bill as it passed the House, is satisfactory to the friends of an open Willamette river.

HUNG HEAD DOWNWARD IN FLOOD OF WATER

[United Press Leased Wire.] Pasadena, Cal., Feb. 13.—After hanging head downward under the ruins of the Rubio Canyon pavilion for more than an hour yesterday, while water from a burst pipe poured over her imprisoned body, Mrs. Fred T. Drew, whose baby boy, Thayer was killed by the collapse of the structure, is hovering between life and death today. Physicians at the hospital say the woman has a chance for recovery but is very seriously injured. Drew and his son, George, who were rescued from the ruins shortly after the landslide which wrecked the building are badly hurt but will recover.

SAYS PEACH CROP IS DESTROYED

St. Catharines, Ont., Feb. 13.—J. L. Housberger, of Jordan, a prominent fruit grower, made the statement today that fully 90 per cent of the peach crop of 1909 already was killed by alternate frosts and mild weather. The small crop generally throughout Niagara Peninsula has been practically destroyed and the loss will run into millions.

TO BUILD A DRY DOCK AT PEARL HARBOR

[United Press Leased Wire.] Washington, Feb. 13.—Eight bids were opened today for the contract of constructing a great drydock at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. The lowest bidder was C. M. Leach, of Boston, who bid \$1,886,883 for dock complete without accessory piling. With accessories \$1,903,437. Other bidders were Edward Mallory, San Francisco; Cotton Brothers Company, Oakland; San Francisco Bridge Co., E. J. Word Construction Company, of Honolulu; Pacific Construction Co., of San Francisco. The award will be made later.

CAN BOSS ITSELF ONLY ONE DAY

years of experience in the house of representative, I am strongly convinced that there must be a change in the rules unless the house is to degenerate permanently into a machine registering the will of the speaker," said Representative E. W. Hayes, of California, today, on the floor of the house, while discussing proposed changes in the rules.

"At the opening of each congress," continued Hayes, "the house is the complete master of itself for just one day; only long enough for it to select a speaker, and to make the rules of the preceding congress the rules of the opening one."
