BILLS, RESOLUTIONS AND DOINGS IN GENERAL BY THE SOLONS

House—9:30 a. m. Feb. 12.
Portrait of General Grant presented by J. S. Cooke of Portland was received by the legislature.

Representative Muncy of Coos and Curry delivered a beautiful eulogy of the character of Grant, which was loudly applauded.

H. B. 268, Bean, substitute from special committee, for state printing board, ayes 34. Passed.

H. B. 150, Eastern Oregon delegation, general scalp bounty act. Passed.

House—Friday Afternoon.
H. B. 221, Purdin, appropriating \$100,000 for Crater Lake road. Passed.

H. B. 351, ways and means committee, Monmouth normal school. Passed.

H. B. 352, ways and means committee, Weston normal school. Passed.

H. B. 353, ways and means committee, Ashland normal school. Passed.

H. B. 354, Carter, relating to corporations.

Senate—Friday.

When the senate was called to order at 10 o'clock it went into the committee of the whole, with Senator Smith of Umatilla in the chair, for the consideration of senate bill 77, the water code. The entire forenoon was occupied in the reading and consideration of the bill. Only a few minor amendments were made. The committee reported that the bill pass as amended. The vote was 22 in favor of the passage of the bill with three against.

Adjourned at 1 o'clock until 4:30 p. m.

THE BASEBALL SITUATION

Unless some baseball promoter decides shortly to buy up the Salem end of the Tri-City franchise, the sport will be cut off in the direction of Portland this year. From present indications there seems to be no one who is willing to take the franchise on their hands and carry it through, in spite of it being a paying proposition heretofore. The Portland teams are still intending to go in action again this season in the Tri-City organization and at a meeting held in Portland lately Forest Grove is said to have been taken in the league. Woodburn and Salem have not made any steps as yet toward placing a team in the field and it is very likely they will not.

Owing to the prospects of Portland being supplied with continuous ball this season by the Pacific Coast, the Northwest and the Tri-City leagues, not mentioning the many other aggregations in the vicinity of Portland which will be in the game, cities lying nearer than 50 miles of Portland are not anxious to venture out with an organization. However, there is now a plan on foot by several well known baseball promoters in Salem and Eugene, which will establish the great American game from Salem as far south as Roseburg. Within another month definite information can be given out in regard to this proposed organization, at which time baseball players can have an opportunity of showing what they can do toward signing up.

Want Car Service

Upon the request of several families living near the extension of the street car line outside of the city limits south of the city, the railroad commission informed the street railway manager here that a passenger service installed on this line would be greatly appreciated. Manager Page has taken the matter up with the officials in Portland and will probably report on it before long. The petition handed the railroad commission was signed by 500 people claiming to reside reasonably close to the extension. This line was constructed by the street car people for the purpose of hauling crushed rock from the quarry to this city when paving was being carried on.
