ROUTINE WORK IN THE LEGISLATURE
Third Reading of Bills.
 S. B. 29, judiciary committee substitute, prohibits games in cigar stores by minors. Passed.
 S. B. 136, Marion delegation, fixing salary sheriff and deputies. Passed.
 S. B. 26, relating to proper care of milk and cream, and creating assistant dairy and food inspectors. Failed to pass, 26 ayes.
 S. B. 151, Miller of Linn and Marion, conservation commission, carries \$1000. Passed.
 S. B. 109, for fish hatchery on the Columbia. Passed.
 S. B. 55, Mullt, relating to estrays, by which owner may claim within two months. Laid on table.
 S. B. No. 9, Schofield, to amend code, relating to ditching, dykes and dams. Passed.
 S. B. 140, to shorten hours of labor for women in telephone and telegraph offices to 10 hours per day, and not over 60 hours per week. Passed.
 S. B. 119, salary circuit court 8th district raised to \$4000. Passed.
 S. B. 37, Cole, requiring a physician's certificate before marriage. Passed.

House Resolutions.

 That secretary of state furnish to the state printer copies of legislative proceedings of all bills enacted by the legislature or the people.
 H. J. R. No. 20, Carter, for state to purchase Condon collection of geological specimens.

 That capitol building commission use \$20,000 of general fund for improvements on capitol.

 H. B. 288, committee on education, relating to uses of school houses. Referred.
 H. B. 296, Rusk, to fix salary of superintendent of Wallows county. Re-referred.
 H. B. 265, Clemmens, to provide for printing of session laws. Passed. Adjourned at 4:30.
