CANADA LAYS CLAIM TO SOUND CHANNELS

[United Press Leased Wire.]
Seattle, Feb. 19.—News from British Columbia that the Canadian government has decided that the waters of Hecate strait and Dixon entrance are within British territory, has aroused much indignation among fishing interests here and it is said the matter will be presented to the state department at Washington.

The ruling, if strictly enforced, would drive a large number of halibut steamers and schooners out of business and local halibut men will make the strongest protests against the interpretation of the treaty by the Ottawa government.

The activity and antipathy of the British Columbia authorities is attributed by American fishermen to jealousy. They assert that the Britishers have not had the luck of Americans and consequently friction has arisen. On the other hand, Captain Newcomb of the British fishing cruiser Kestrel charges Americans with disregarding all regulations, accusing them of stealing 1,600,000 pounds of halibut in February and March of last year.

This is due, he adds, to insufficient protection by the Canadian vessels.

THREE DROWNED IN PUGET SOUND

[United Press Leased Wire.]
Prince Rupert, B. C., Feb. 19.—There now seems but little doubt that the three settlers, Cameron, Dobbin and Yentoff, who sailed from Preacher Island for the mainland, January 24, and have since been missing, were caught in a storm and drowned. The provincial police, with a patrol launch have made diligent search of the coast line and all the islands in the vicinity, but without finding any trace of the missing men.

The men started out in a small boat, and several days later a pair of oars were picked up on the shore of Lucy Island by the Lighthouse keeper. The find was reported to the police, and a search for the missing men was at once begun.
