UNCLE TOM'S CABIN AT THE GRAND TONIGHT

With what are claimed to be the most beautiful stage settings and pictures ever shown in this state, the Stetson revival of "Uncle Tom's Cabin," that famous classic of the American stage, comes to the Grand opera house tonight.

The play has been seen in every section of this country and in almost every village of the north, east and west. It has had and has retained a popularity never equaled and never known by any other play and now comes in the best and most complete setting ever made for it, and is played by a company of more than 25 persons, of whom several are southern darkies, whose harmonious voices blend in the old plantation melodies and the old southern slave songs that long ago touched the heart of a nation, making an effectiveness and realism never before known in "Uncle Tom's Cabin."

The company is said to be fully worthy of the elaborate scenic settings of the play. Its members have been especially selected for their experience in the parts assigned them and from their adaptability to the characters. The result has been a rarely harmonious whole, it is claimed, and has done much to add to the effectiveness of the production. The scenery has been painted specially for this revival and includes a number of handsome scenes reproduced from photographs of the localities mentioned in the book, as they were in the time when the great authoress first wrote the story, more than fifty years ago. Some of the most notable of these scenes are the "Suwanee river" by moonlight, the cotton fields in full bloom, the Ohio river in winter and the escape of Eliza carrying her child across the floating ice, the rocky pass in which George Harris made his stand against the men pursuing him and protect his family; the St. Clair home, the levee at New Orleans showing a slave auction; Legree's plantation, and lastly the beautiful transformation scene, showing Eva's ascension to the Celestial City. The play has long since been public property and has been played by many poor companies until the public has come to recognize the fact that none but Manager Washburn has the one great unequalled organization, and that is why his production always brings the theatre-going crowd. The Stetson production is judicially considered an era in the history of Harriet Beecher Stowe's great novel.

BATTLE FLEET CAUSES DEATH OF SEVEN

Delmar, Del., Feb. 22.—Filled with passengers on route to Norfolk to witness the reception of the battleship fleet, the first section of Pennsylvania train No. 49, southbound, collided with two locomotives in the yards here today, and seven men were killed. Seven bodies were recovered shortly after the collision, and another is believed to be in the wreckage.

Shortly after the crash fire added its horror to the wreck. The flames quickly destroyed a combination baggage and mail car, and attacked the smoking coach before it was subdued. All the dead are known to have been employees.

Many passengers were bruised and shaken, but according to the latest reports none were seriously injured. It was learned that two passengers received sprained shoulders, one being Miss Sophia Ashanskoplos, of Memphis, Tenn.

Princess Trixie, an educated horse, belonging to a theatrical company, was killed, and its groom, Lewis Brockway, slightly injured.

Traffic on the road was delayed for half an hour.
