TACOMA LADIES ARE KNOCKED OUT BY BEER

(United Press Leased Wire.)

Tacoma, Feb. 22.—Several women shoppers are today nursing sundry bruises and slowly recovering their normal mental poise, following a one-sided encounter with a runaway barrel of beer Saturday afternoon.

During the busiest shopping period the big cask of good cheer slipped its moorings on a beer wagon and came bounding down the steep hill at Ninth and C streets. Hundreds of persons, mostly women, were hurrying across the street. One woman, all undiminished of the approaching foaming peril, turned to get a better view of a late style in feminine headgear which adorned another woman. In another moment she was tossed high in the air and alighted

in the gutter, a tumbled heap of bewildered womankind.

Then the execution of the uncontrollable barrel of "suds" increased. Women intent upon their shopping enterprises were bowled over promiscuously and without regard to age or condition. Many treasured articles of raiment were irretrievably ruined and considerable injury to body and mind was inflicted before the runaway hop product brought up with a final crash of defiance in front of the Young Women's Christian Association headquarters, where it was later rescued by the wagon driver.

Threats of damage suits against the brewing company owning the beer are being made today by several of the bruised and indignant women.

Portland, Or., Feb. 22.—Washington's birthday is being celebrated today in Portland in a quiet manner and without ostentation. This morning the Peninsula Rose Society celebrated the anniversary with appropriate exercises. This afternoon the Daughters of the American Revolution are being entertained at the Portland Heights Club. Tonight the Sons and Daughters of the American Revolution will celebrate the occasion at a banquet given at the Hotel Portland. The Knights of Columbus will hold exercises at the Alumnus Hall tonight.

The principal public function was the rose planting held this afternoon at the Forestry building, where an elaborate program was carried out.

GREAT RECLAMATION WORK COMPLETED

Boise, Feb. 22.—In the presence of the members of the Idaho legislature, state officials, officers of the reclamation service and hundreds of homeseekers, the Payette-Boise irrigation project, the greatest piece of reclamation work ever undertaken by the government, was today formally opened to the public.

Water from the Boise river is diverted into a canal to the Deer Flat reservoir, 20 miles distant, covering about 200,000 acres or all of Ada and Canyon counties. The Deer Flat reservoir will be the largest body of artificial water in the world. Steel shovels, similar to those in use on the Panama canal, are doing wonderful work in digging the great irrigation ditch. Special trains, bringing settlers from every direction, arrived last night and early today. The opening of the project means that a vast territory will soon be ready for the building of homes.

ALONZO W. GESNER HOME FROM PRINEVILLE

Lon Gesner arrived last night from a trip to Prineville. He was gone three weeks, over the route where Harriman is supposed to build up the Deschutes, across the peninsula, via the Crooked river, out on the South Fork to Prineville, and on to Burns and Ontario. Mr. Gesner says it will be a water level line, and the whole country will grow grain without irrigation. He ought to know as he has surveyed over 600,000 acres of land in that country.

FEARS ENTERTAINED THAT COOK IS LOST

(United Press Leased Wire.)

Seattle, Feb. 22.—Whether Dr. Frederick A. Cook, who accompanied the expedition to Mount McKinley out of Seattle in 1906, has discovered the north pole as he set out to do, or has been lost in the Arctic wastes is being discussed today by friends of the daring explorer in this city.

Cook is well known in Seattle and his many friends here have been appealed to by Mrs. Cook, the explorer's wife, who resides in Brooklyn, N. Y., to organize a relief expedition to go

in search of him. Appeals have also been made to the Arctic Club of New York and other individuals and organizations in the east, but thus far without any definite action being taken.

Walter P. Miller, a photographer of this city, who accompanied the Mount McKinley expedition, said today that he does not believe that Cook is lost. "He has been injured to the rigors of polar cold and readily adapts himself to any condition in which he finds himself," said Miller. "Captain Robert E. Peary is in that part of Greenland where Cook was last heard from and Cook has had sufficient time to have made the dash to the pole and return to Sabin bay and meet Peary."

TAXES COME IN VERY FREELY

(United Press Leased Wire.) Sheriff Minto, as tax collector made another large turnover Saturday of tax money. This, the third turnover for the present collection, amounting to \$34,845.86, which shows a large amount over any other delivery so far.

The state and county tax was \$17,250.94, state and school \$6215.07, library \$94.53, indigent soldiers \$79.98, road tax \$2010.86. The road tax is coming in at a good rate, and every road district has been heard from. Road district No. 34 is the leader, having paid over to the sheriff \$626.36, and No. 24 is still the highest district on the books. School dis-
