SENATE KILLED GREAT NUMBER OF HOUSE BILLS

The following bills failed to pass the senate:

- H. B. 188, Jones of Lincoln and Polk, permitting Polk county to retain hunters' license fees.
- H. B. 230, Hughes, providing a tax exemption of \$300.
- H. B. 174, Jones of Clackamas, permitting school districts to provide for textbooks for pupils.
- H. B. 350, Bryant, authorizing county courts to appropriate not to exceed \$2000 annually, for agricultural fairs.
- H. B. 276, Farrell, increasing expenses of master fish warden from \$1700 to \$3000 per annum.
- S. B. 223, Balley, fixing rates to be paid state printer.
- H. B. 259, Clackamas county delegation, providing uniform eight-hour workday in manufacturing institutions operated continuously.
- S. B. 248, Nottingham, providing for competitive bidding in procuring plans and architectural work on public buildings.
- H. B. 267, Hughes requiring tillage-burning apparatus to be supplied with safety device.
- S. B. 94, Barrett, for protection of salt-water crabs in Lincoln county.
- H. B. 129, McKinney, requiring persons and corporations operating mines to file sworn statement of their financial standing.
- H. B. 33, Bedillion, providing for collection of road poll tax in incorporated cities and towns.
- H. B. 124, Reynolds, creating office of fire marshal. Only five votes for bill.
- H. B. 302, committee on banking, providing additional deputy bank examiner and requiring semi-annual examinations of all banks—9 to 16
- H. B. 154, Altman, reducing course of study in county high schools from three to two years.
