SENATE COMMITTEE STRIKES A BUMP
 Washington, Feb. 23.—Friends of President Roosevelt in congress are quietly laughing today at a predicament which the president's enemies have placed themselves by their eagerness to prove him guilty of a violation of the law.
 The senators on the committee on judiciary, after having found the president guilty to their satisfaction of countenancing a violation of the anti-trust law by sanctioning a merger of the United States Steel Corporation and the Tennessee Coal and Iron Company, have suddenly acquired cold feet. They wrote a report to that effect, and it has been printed. It was to be submitted to the senate today, but last night the attack of cold feet came on and no report was made. The senators confidentially explained the matter this way to their colleagues:
 "We have found the president guilty in this report. Now, if we submit the report, the president may charge us with finding the president guilty before he is tried. If he is guilty of any violation of law, it is the duty of the house to impeach him. The public will ask why we don't go ahead and impeach the president, if we believe him guilty; but the members of the house will not bring impeachment proceedings."
 "They say the president is about to go out of office, but they would not impeach him, even if he were at the beginning of the term. Where will we stand if we submit this report? The public is likely to taunt us with cowardice in not getting after the president after we have declared him to be a law-breaker. So we don't know what to do."

SEATTLE BOOSTERS ARRIVE IN SAN FRANCISCO
 [United Press Leased Wire.]
 San Francisco, Feb. 23.—The Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition boosters, one hundred strong, are in the city today on their journey from Seattle and Tacoma via Oregon and Portland, partly for their own enjoyment and partly to let the people of California know about the exposition. The special train in which the Seattle party is making its trip is composed of six Pullmans, with dining and observation cars. Arriving in Oakland yesterday morning they spent the day in that city and in seeing the University of California, coming across the bay late in the afternoon to take dinner at the Fairmont, where they remained for the night.
 Among the members of the party are the following:
 John F. Miller, mayor of Seattle; I. A. Nadeau, director general of the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition; C. B. Yandell, secretary of the Seattle Chamber of Commerce; Edmund S. Meaney, professor of history, University of Washington; Lloyd W. McDowell, division of exploitation Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition; W. R. Bradley, representing the Tacoma Chamber of Commerce; D. L. Cornell, Tacoma Commercial Club, and Lucian F. Cook, Tacoma Boosters' Club.
 Today the party will go to Mount Tamalpais, returning to the Fairmont again for dinner, and tomorrow morning their train will start at 9 o'clock from the Third-street depot for Los Angeles, with stops at Palo Alto, Del Monte, Paso Robles and Santa Barbara.
