A resolution was upanimously passed, to be presented to the council, that all improvements in fifth ward should conform to the Tillman grade, which was also approved by the visiting councilmen.

Another resolution was also passed requesting the city council to have a mirvey made for at least three sewers, and to have them all in one comprehensive system and so constructed as to accommodate Englewood and Rosedale additions, and they be constructed on Highland avenue, Belmont and Shipping streets, of found to be the best, and all three to be constructed this summer as far east as Capital street.

The subject for discussion at the next meeting will be street improvements, mountain water, a cityowned rock quarry and crusher, so we can pave our streets at the minimum cost.
