THE JANITOR WHO HAD HIS PICTURE "TOOK"

 Chicago, Feb. 27.—After twenty years of struggle against overwhelming odds, Charles E. Hallburg, a janitor in the Austin State Bank building, today is in possession of a letter from the Guttenberg Art Gallery notifying him that his painting "Atlantic" has been accepted by the institution.

Hallburg occupies a position unique in the world of art. Without instruction other than that given him by various artists whose studios he cleaned, the janitor picked up the rudiments of his craft. When a young man he crossed the Atlantic and the impression of the great body of water remained so vividly in his mind that after he had learned to draw and paint he began the composition of marine sketches.

The picture which won Hallburg fame is a view of the Atlantic many years after the man had left the ocean behind him and resided in an inland city. It is valued at \$500 by the Guttenberg gallery, one of the world's most noted galleries.

WANT THE FLEET ON THIS SIDE

 Washington, Feb. 27.—The members of the Pacific coast delegations in the senate today are making strenuous efforts to prevent the defeat of amendments to the naval bill providing for the division of the fleet to provide protection for the Pacific coast following the refusal of the house to pass the measure.

The house also refused to sanction the provision for the selection of a site for another navy yard in California. During a discussion favorable the house also voted to limit the sum for the construction of one collier at Mare Island to cost \$900,000. If the collier cannot be built for that amount the outcome will be that no collier will be built on the Pacific coast during the ensuing year.

SHOULD HAVE SAID "JOHN AND I IS TIRED"

 San Leandro, Cal., Feb. 27.—All San Leandro today is up in arms over the action of Vice Principal Charles Benner of the local grammar school, in lashing two girls over the hands with a heavy strap because they made the mistake in their class room of saying "John and I am tired," instead of "John and I are tired." The board of education is being urged to investigate the matter with a view to Benner's dismissal.

Edna Peters, 13 years old, and Alvena Damont, 15, were the victims of Benner's strenuous disciplinary treatment. The parents of the girls are highly indignant and have begun an inquiry.

William Hazen, principal of the school, says he gave his subordinate Benner permission to punish those pupils who made grammatical errors, but that he had no idea that his assistant would do what he did.

MAY SERVE FOURTEEN YEARS FOR 54 DOLLARS

 Spokane, Feb. 27.—Pending an appeal in her case in court where she was sentenced to prison for forgery, Mrs. Maybelle Cottrell, wife of a mining man of Butte, is at liberty today on bonds of \$2000.

If the sentence which was pronounced yesterday stands, she will have to serve an indeterminate term of from one to fourteen years. It was charged that Mrs. Cottrell forged the name of Col. D. P. Jenkins of Spokane, a pioneer millionaire, for \$54. The check was passed in a dry goods store. On account of financial difficulties Mrs. Cottrell was obliged to seek employment, her first place being in the home of Colonel Jenkins as housekeeper.

LOVED HER EVEN AFTER HE SAW HER EAT

 Seattle, Wash., Feb. 27.—Rescued from death or injury under the wheels of a street car, and married to her rescuer within two hours afterward, is the new record for speed in matrimonial experience, established in Seattle by Miss Ellen Shellito, of Crossville, Tenn.

Miss Shellito had been in the city but a few hours, when, in crossing a down town street, became confused, and stepped directly in front of an approaching car. At this juncture Alexander Mackel, six feet six inches in height and a lawyer of Butte, Mont., grasped the fair Southern girl about the waist and lifted her from the track. An invitation to dinner, which was accepted by the girl, followed.

During the progress of the meal Miss Shellito told her rescuer about coming West to seek a position as school teacher.

"For a long time we were silent," said Mackel today. "We just looked at each other. Then—well, I told her that I loved her, and asked her to become my bride. She hesitated, but finally consented, and I summoned an automobile, and we were driven to the auditor's office. Then we went to the parsonage of Rev. J. D. O. Powers, of the Unitarian church and were married.

They left for Butte today, where they will make their home.
