

BROOKE GAINED VICTORIES IN SPITE OF YOUTH

SAVED THE FAIR APPROPRIATION FOR SALEM--GETS A BOUQUET FROM THE WILLAMETTE VALLEY--MADE A FINE RECORD

On leaving for his home at Ontario, Representative Brooke of Harney and Malheur (who saved the big state fair for Salem), talked freely of his impressions of the legislature. He frankly admitted some things might better have been left undone, but expressed satisfaction with his first experience in law making. Mr. Brooke kept close to the organization, and while he was next to the youngest member of the legislature and did not intend to take a prominent part in the proceedings, he was forced into almost a leading position before adjournment. As a local representative he goes home with a \$10,000 bridge appropriation dangling at his belt. There will be a fine \$50,000 steel bridge across the Snake at Ontario as a monument to his enterprise. The scalp bounty bill by the Eastern Oregon delegation was overtaken by the sleeping sickness that consigned many measures to oblivion, but Brooke aroused the common bill to exterminate coyotes and cougars and insured its passage to safety. He will be rewarded by the bleating of frisking lambs on the hillsides of Eastern Oregon if not by the overburdened taxpayer.

When the irrigation code came up

for final action in the house, Brooke as chairman of the irrigation committee became the standing target for rapid fire questions from the opposition and was on his feet to the end of the roll call that landed that important measure. Brooke led a fight for a minority report on Hart's bill for two additional supreme judges, and Bowerman's bill to permit circuit judges to be transferred to relieve congested dockets, and won out on both. While he did not trade or traffic on measures, Brooke made a consistent record for progress all along the line, and secured an additional experiment station that will probably be located in Harney county to test dry farming experiments. He showed his independence by voting against the tariff on lumber. He opposed or championed so-called reform bills and stood for what he considered right from the standpoint of principle, regardless of particular bids for temporary popularity.

Mr. Brooke demonstrated the newer leadership of the younger Republican party of Oregon. He will be heard from in the future councils of the party along the same lines as a builder rather than a destroyer by factionalism of the majority party in Oregon.

SO EXTRA CAREFUL HE LOST HIS MONEY

Seattle, Wash., March 1.—As a result of a brilliant scheme to outwit possible hold-up men, D. D. Dede, who lives near Taylor's Mills, is today conducting a hopeless search for a wallet which contained \$700, which he craftily secreted under the seat of a street car last night. Dede has long feared that he might become the victim of robbers, which fear has lately been increased by a couple of street car holdups. So when, late last night he set out for home on a Seattle, Renton and Southern car, he took precautions to protect his wealth. When none of the passengers

were looking, Dede stealthily stooped down and stowed the wallet containing the \$700 under the seat of the car. Then he assumed an innocent air and began perusing the breakfast food ads across the aisle.

The car went through without incident, and Dede proceeded to his home without meeting any desperadoes. Some time later he bethought him of the roll of greenbacks that had reposed in his right-hand trousers pocket. He telephoned to the street car officials. They found nothing. The car was no 23, and Dede has little hope of recovering his currency.

SHAUNTZ STORE ROBBED AGAIN

Some time between late Saturday night and early this morning the Shauntz second-hand store on Court street was entered by burglars and goods stolen amounting to several hundred dollars.

Among the articles missing were several gold watches, revolvers, razors, clothing and some silverware. The thieves carried the things away in a blue telescope grip which they also helped themselves to from the store, but outside of this, no clue was left for the police to work upon. A long, tapering piece of steel was found lying on the floor this morning by Chief of Police Gibson, it evidently having been used as a jimmy to pry open the rear door. Upon comparing this piece of steel with the brake shoe key used by the burglars who entered the Barnes Cash store several months ago and beat up a young man sleeping there, it was an exact mate, and it is thought by the police that the same persons were responsible for the Shauntz robbery. The sheriff's office was notified also and the officers are working together on the case.

POPE PIUS X TIRES OF VATICAN

Rome, March 1.—The yearning with which Pope Pius X longs for freedom from Vatican restraint was illustrated today by a remark made by the Holy Father, shortly after a lioness, which escaped from a cage in the Vatican, was presented from entering a shrine in which the pope was at prayer.

"Even beasts living in the Vatican absorbed atmosphere long for freedom," the holy father is said to have remarked wittily. "I do not believe she would have eaten men on the first Friday in Lent." The lioness was captured by the Vatican guards, after she had prowled through a portion of the grounds.

The pope said mass in a private chapel this morning, and expects to resume public audiences Wednesday.
