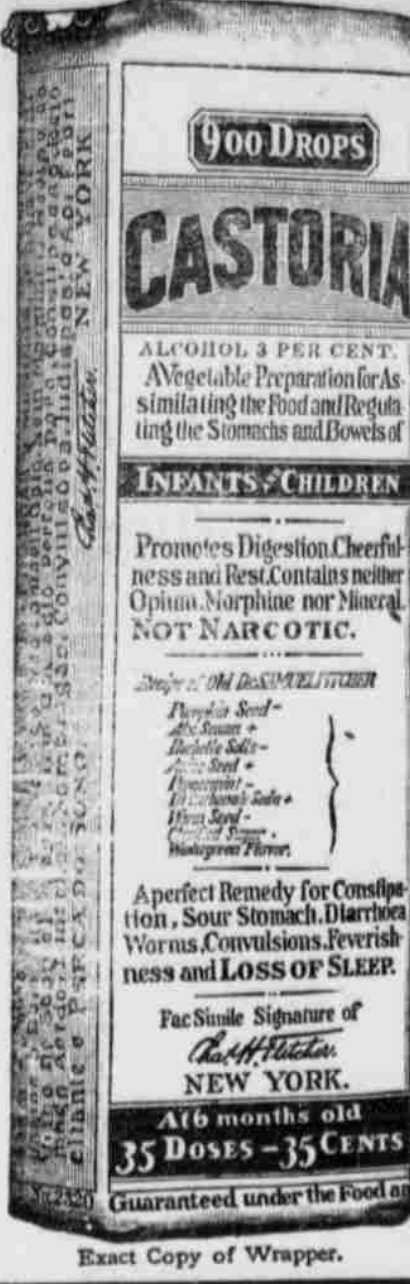

SENATOR HART DISCOURSES ON THE LEGISLATURE LEGISLATURE PASSED SEVERAL GOOD LAWS—NEW EDUCATIONAL LAWS

Senator Hart of Baker City has returned to his home, where he has built up a fine law practice. He was one of the clean and progressive leaders in the senate, and is inclined to believe that the legislature as a whole was better than it has been pictured. He says he believes the legislature was better than the average. "Few bad bills passed and most of the members worked for what they really thought was best for the state. There was very little trading and bills mostly went up and down on their merits. With the senatorial election out of the way this result was possible, and the conditions under which legislation is conducted are improved in every way. I believe the direct primary law and the direct election of senators have come to stay and the Republican party should accept the result and adjust itself to the changed political system. The people will never go back to the old way. I consider the tax commission bill the greatest measure of a beneficial nature that was enacted. The two commissioners, C. V. Galloway of Yamhill county and J. B. Eaton of Union county, are men who will work hard to dig up new sources of revenue other than direct taxes. The people will not stand for any further direct taxes in my opinion. The new water code and the Eaton bill to tax water powers belonging to the state are in the line of progress. The bill to secure a six months school to every country district will help conditions in the little, neglected schools of the state and help the reputation of the whole state.

"It was a mistake to abolish the normal schools, and the state will live to see it. I understand that nearly 400 students have paid six months tuition in advance and are deprived of four months schooling for which they have paid, and there was no provision made to return the money. That may be fair treatment but I doubt it."

Mr. Hart was formerly a county superintendent of schools and public prosecutor in the Willamette valley. He can be said to have been the leader of the senate, where as chairman of the judiciary committee he exercised a predominating influence on all legislation of importance.
