IDAHO PASSES THE DIRECT PRIMARY LAW

(United Press Leased Wire.)

Boise, Idaho, March 2.—After being caught in many tight pinches and even threatened with death, the direct primary bill is today triumphant, for, bearing the stamp of approval of the senate and house, it awaits the signature of Governor Brady, who has welcomed it.

One of the hardest fights made against the measure was in caucus, but Senators Shawhan and Rowton defended the bill bravely and won in an exciting finish.

One by one they protested vigorously against propositions to compromise or amend, realizing that the slightest change would defeat the bill finally. Ten Democrats finally came to the aid of the two Republican senators and as 12 votes were sufficient to pass the bill, it was adopted. Although it was a Republican bill by introduction, Shawhan and Rowton were the only two Republicans who voted for it.

MADE A DESPERATE ATTEMPT AT SUICIDE

(United Press Leased Wire.)

North Yakima, Wash., March 2.—Confined in the county jail because it was believed he was on the verge of delirium tremens, S. Sutherland, a laborer, is alive today after having made four desperate attempts to take his own life in his cell yesterday. Shortly after being locked up the jailer was aroused by the noise of a fall, and hurrying to the cell occupied by Sutherland, discovered the man had hanged himself with a necktie, but the cord had broken. Then the would-be suicide tried to strangle himself with his suspenders, but they, too, broke. The leather strings in the man's shoes were next brought into requisition and Sutherland hanged himself with these. The jailer rescued him just as he was lapsing into unconsciousness. Sutherland's last attempt was made with a cuff fastener with which he tried to sever the veins in his wrist, but the implement was dull. Sutherland will be examined as to his sanity.

IN THE HEAT OR BATTLE.

After the game was over and the contestants had returned to their various homes one of the heroes of the winning team complained of a feeling of soreness in the lower part of his neck.
