BLACK HAND HORROR

[United Press Leased Wire.]

New York, March 3.—Ten Italians dead, half a score more writhing in agony on hospital cots from burns or broken limbs, is the latest toll exacted by the "black hand," which is charged with firing a Seventh avenue tenement house early today.

As the flames were driven back by a horde of firemen the full atrocity of the crime was revealed. Charred corpses lay on the blackened remains of stair landings, three bodies, burned unrecognizable, were found locked in a death embrace in a window opening on an airshaft. Many were found kneeling as though in prayer. Everywhere was the indication that the five-story tenement, crowded with sleeping Italians, had been flooded with oil from basement to roof and fired.

Despite the handicap of oil soaked floors and of blazing pools of oil in two airshafts which, acting as flues, spread the flames to all floors, firemen and police fearlessly entered the building and prevented the death list from reaching fifty.

In the performance of their duty six policemen and ten firemen were badly burned. Several firemen escaped death by jumping into the life nets spread by their comrades in the street below.

On the ground floor of the building was an undertaking shop and overhead were housed thirty families, whose members were sleeping when the fire flared started the blaze. Patrick Monks, employed by the undertaker, gave the alarm and attempted to arouse the sleeping Italians, but was driven from the building by fire and smoke. When the fire apparatus arrived excited and frightened men, women and children were fighting for freedom in the smoke-filled, dark and narrow halls.

While the firemen were working at the front of the building the police attacked the rear. Here it was discovered that the fire escapes were useless because of piles of rubbish and household goods which had been allowed, contrary to law, to occupy the iron balconies.

Policemen Riley, Gallagher and Gentry made their way to the third floor of an adjoining house, where Gallagher, supported by his companions, swung himself to a window ledge of the burning building by means of shutters. There he passed out a man and two children, all of whom were unconscious.

While an extension ladder was being placed opposite a window on the fifth floor, Firemen Clark and McCarthy ran up the swaying ladder, jumped for the window ledge and disappeared into the room from which smoke and flames were spouting. Hardly had the ladder been steadied against the window ledge when they appeared carrying two unconscious women, who were passed to the street. McCarthy re-entered the room and rescued two small children. As he was descending the ladder, a man appeared at a second story window, holding a child. "Here, take him!" the man cried, and tossed the little one to McCarthy, who caught the babe in mid-air and brought it safely to the ground. The next instant the man in the window jumped. He was badly injured by the fall and was taken to a hospital. The work of the firemen and police was marvelous and a number of similar rescues equally as sensational were made.

Seven persons on the fourth and fifth floors saved themselves by jumping into life nets held by firemen. The spectacular and dramatic features of the fire drew great crowds of people despite the early hour and the cold. These were mostly excitable Italians and the police had great difficulty in keeping them from rushing frantically into the flames to rescue a relative or friend.

The fire was brought under control after the flames had licked up the interior of the building. Because of the cheap construction of the building a loss only of \$5000 was sustained.

The police started an investigation and it was predicted that arrests would follow.
