**LIBBY MADE A GOOD RECORD**  
 Hon. A. C. Libby, of Jefferson, was in the city the other day, looking over the situation and conferring with Governor Benson as to the advisability of a special session. So far as he was concerned he did not seem to care if the legislature never met again, although he expressed regret that the appropriation bill, after it had passed both houses, was recalled to the senate to be patched up again, and finally got lost in the shuffle. He also thought the senate did wrong in cutting off the normal schools in the midst of their work, and after the students had paid a year's subscription.

Mr. Libby pressed the one board bill for all the educational institutions, which got only a few votes on a motion to "indefinitely postpone" but which has created great interest, and caused Speaker McArthur to put through his bill to cut off all duplicate courses in the rival institutions, which was the principal reform aimed at in the Libby bill. Mr. Libby got through the resolution turning over ten per cent of the income from forest reserves to the school fund. He opposed the Johnson road law, opposed the bill to appropriate \$9000 for three dairy inspectors, to be named by State Food and Dairy Commissioner Bailey, who is in partnership with the Scotts at Portland in the dairy business, and got it amended to have the governor appoint them, but the amendment was "queered" in the enrolling committee. On the bill to raise the per diem of members of the legislature he voted so, saying he had sense enough to take a tip from the people, who had voted down an amendment to increase the salaries of legislators. Libby voted against a great many appropriations and is prepared to render an account to Morning Star Grange.
