**MILITARY FEATURES OF ALASKA-YUKON EXPO**

Seattle, Wash., March 5.—The military features of the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition will include a model army camp, maneuvers of armed troops and military bands, if the plans of the department of events meets with success.

Senator Piles has been asked to request the war department to order the Fourteenth United States cavalry, now stationed at Walla Walla, to make camp on the government right of way from May 15 to the close of the exposition. The Fourteenth is a splendid regiment, and has its own mounted band. An assignment of West Point cadets will also be requested.

It is the intention to have a grand military and naval parade on the opening day, June 1. The navy department will be requested to allow blue jackets from the Pacific squadron, which will be stationed here, to take part.

**GUST KOKOKANAS IS CAUGHT BY SEATTLE GIRL**

Seattle, Wash., March 5.—For accosting on the street Miss May Walker, secretary of the Young Women's Christian Association, Gust Kokokanas today began serving 30 days on the chain gang. In addition, he was fined \$100. Miss Walker testified that, after Kokokanas had accosted her, she kept an appointment with him at a restaurant, having previously notified the police. Here the man was arrested by two detectives.

To protect young women from the

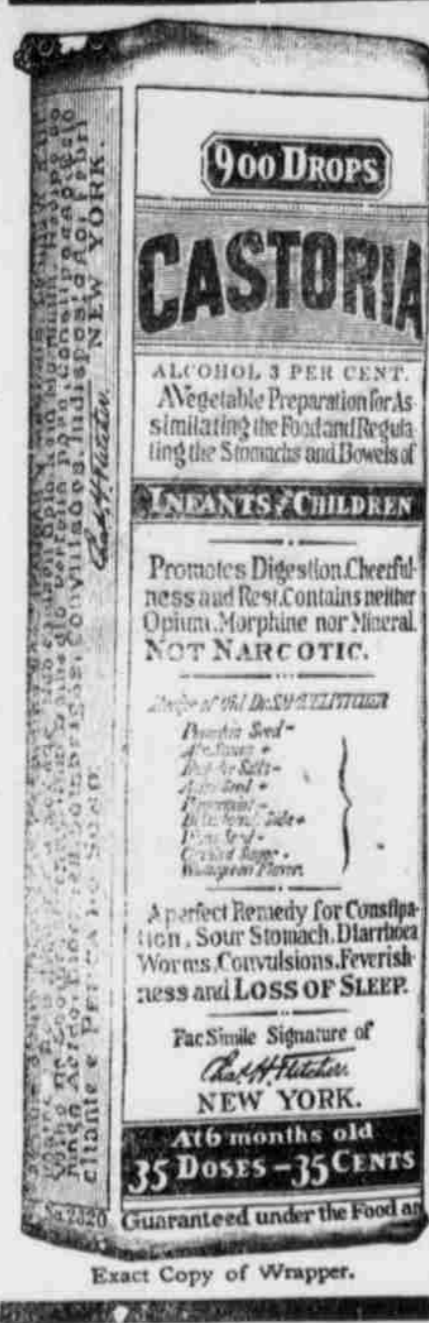

**IN TOUCH WITH LAND CLEAR ACROSS PACIFIC**

Seattle, Wash., March 5.—With its wireless equipment the Nippon Yusen Kaisha steamship Akimaru has performed the feat of completing the passage of 4240 miles from Yokohama to Puget Sound without being out of communication with either shore. The big steamer has just arrived in this port from the Orient via Victoria.

Captain Nagao explains that the wireless service was maintained by the aid of other vessels of his line and government stations in Japan and British Columbia. To a point in the Pacific more than 1000 miles off the Japanese coast, the instruments were almost constantly taking messages direct from the Japanese land stations.
