TO CUT OUT JAPS AT HONOLULU

Honolulu, March 9.—An increasing amount of smuggling on the part of the Japanese fishing fleet in and about the Hawaiian group today led to a decision on the part of the local customs officers to appeal to Washington for a rigid investigation. The treasury department will be asked to dispatch a fleet of revenue cutters to the islands, to be stationed here until the smuggling traffic is broken up.

Owing to the volume of trade and the few customs officials in the islands, there has been no opportunity for a campaign against the smugglers.

It has been learned, however, that Japanese sampans of the fishing boat fleet are being equipped rapidly with gasoline engines. The local officers cannot see the need of speedy sampans, equipped with engines valued at \$1000 each for fishing, and are inclined to think that the smuggling of silks and other commodities will increase as more sampans are furnished with engines.

The danger of the fleet to the coast protection of the islands in event of war with Japan is also being discussed. The fishermen know the coast well, and their little surf boats, equipped with gasoline engines, could aid materially in the landing of men from warships.

AFTER SEVEN YEARS CAPTURE MURDERER

Chicago, March 9.—After a chase of seven years for the murderer of Policeman Patrick Duffy of the Chicago force, the police are in receipt of the information that the murderer is Vincent Briscoe, alias Britton, who is serving a sentence for burglary in San Quentin prison, in California, registered under the name of Frank Bennett.

The Chicago police officials claim that Briscoe and a man named Hugh Reilly broke into a house in Chicago in 1902 and were discovered by Duffy. Duffy stopped Reilly and after asking him a few questions began to search him. At this moment Briscoe, according to the police, stole up unobserved and shot Duffy in the eye, killing him instantly. The men then made their escape.

The Chicago police department has endeavored since that time to get a trace of the murderer. Reilly was found finally and sentenced to thirty years in the penitentiary. It is probable that Briscoe will be brought here and placed on trial as soon as his sentence for burglary expires.
