PORTLAND FACTORY BURNED LAST NIGHT

Portland, March 11.—Heaps of smouldering ruins are all that remains today to mark the spot where the big sash and door factory of George Ainslie & Co. stood when flames attacked it late last night. The plant occupied an entire block in the north end of the city and was one of the pioneer mills in this vicinity. By the time the firemen arrived on the scene the fire had gained such headway that they devoted their efforts to saving adjoining buildings. Three fire fighters were painfully injured by the explosion of gun powder in one of the buildings. The property destroyed was valued at \$50,000. The cause of the fire is unknown.

NELS PETERSON KILLED IN FIRE AT ASTORIA

Astoria, Or., March 11.—With his skull crushed by an ax, Nels Peterson is dying in a hospital today, and a man giving the name of C. Davis and "the woman in the case" are under arrest, following a fierce fight between the two men. Jealousy over a woman led to the trouble. The two men met in a down-town resort last night, and hostilities started. Davis being armed with an ax, and Peterson using his fists. Finally Davis, it is charged, swung the ax against his rival's head, felling him. Peterson has not regained consciousness. One side of his head was crushed in.

WILL PROHIBIT WOMEN WEARING PLUMAGE

Sacramento, Cal., March 11.—If the Collier bill should be signed by Governor Gillette today, the women's suffrage movement in this state will be given a decided impetus. The bill prohibits the wearing of plumage, skin or body of any bird, not a game bird or hawk. The sacred art of millinery is threatened, and the suffragettes are gleeful. Not only will the wearing of birds or their feathers on hats be prohibited, but it will be a misdemeanor for anyone to have the forbidden wings, aligrettes and crests in their possession.

PROSECUTED THE MILK-MAN

Seattle, Wash., March 11.—Because the baby did not thrive on the lactated fluid supplied by his milkman, W. G. Seward, who resides on Aurora Avenue, has sworn to a complaint charging E. J. Ross, of the North Creek Dairy Farm with putting formaldehyde in his milk. So far as the city attorney can remember, this is the first time a private citizen, an actual consumer of milk, has gone to the trouble of having the milk analyzed and then prosecuted the dealer.

Ashland Hospital Burns.

Fire, which started from a defective flue in the attic of the Southern Oregon hospital, at Ashland, Tuesday morning, enveloped the entire upper portion of the frame structure, which was badly gutted before the flames were gotten under control. Eight patients, bedfast, were carried out safely on litters, and all occupants and attendants at the hospital escaped without injury. The damage to the building and furnishings will perhaps reach \$4000, with little insurance.
