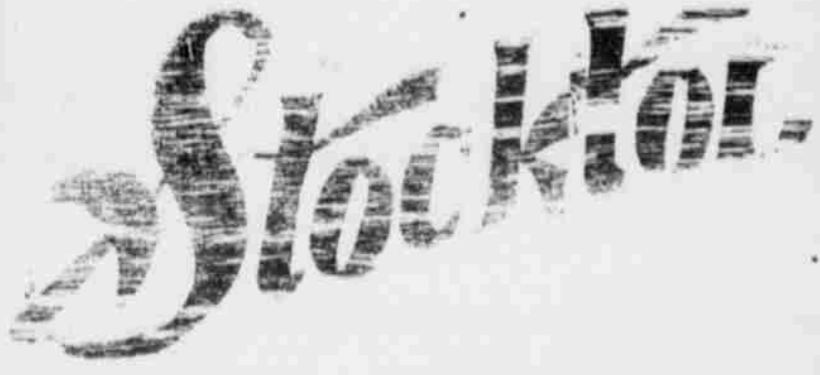

## COMMITTEE AGREES ON BOULEVARD TO FAIR GROUNDS

The committee appointed by the city council some time ago to select a feasible and satisfactory route over which to build the fair grounds boulevard has agreed on the matter, and will report soon.

After going over the grounds carefully in North Salem, and making investigations of the different routes leading to the fair grounds, it was thought best to construct the boulevard from Winter street straight north to Highland avenue, thence east on Highland avenue direct to the Southern Pacific track. There is a section of property lying between the end of Winter street and Highland avenue which has not been opened up, and, if this property can be secured from the present holder, for the purpose of constructing the highway, the balance of the work will be easy.

The committee also found that, by converting a small corner of land in front of the Southern Pacific station at the fair grounds to the use of the proposed boulevard, a terminus for the boulevard could be made which would be satisfactory. This small corner is partly owned by the state and partly by Samuel Casto, and if it is procured the curve on Highland avenue and the fair ground road intersection will be cut out, and a straight road constructed to the main gate of the grounds over Highland avenue, providing this route is used. In this manner the committee believes all street car tracks can finish their run directly to the gates of the fairgrounds on one side of the road and the autos, carriages and other vehicles can reach the grounds on the other.

Providing the above route cannot be secured, the committee will recommend the fair ground route. The consideration of the route also calls for the attention of the property holders along that section. A space of 25 feet is required on the East side of the road to properly construct the boulevard. The highway will be started from an intersection of Capital street and run north to a point where a cross street extends very near the gates of the fair grounds. Over this cross street the vehicle class will be deflected, and, if the small corner near the fair grounds station can be procured, the street railway system will be built as stated before, and in this way the traffic will not be congested.

Several of the property holders along the lines proposed have shown their willingness to consent by contributing, and from different standpoints the real estate men are of the opinion that if the plan is put through property value will be much increased along the line of the fair ground road.
