FIFTH WARD WANTS THE ROAD TO FAIR GROUNDS

Editor Journal: Some people seem to think that Fifth ward is opposed to a boulevard to the fair grounds; such is not the case. The only objections the Fifth ward Improvement League had was the proposed route. Why put it entirely to one side of the town and make it impossible for the farmers or any one else to reach it, in coming into town? The proposed plan would take the boulevard practically useless except the one week of the fair during the entire year, except for private speeding.

Almost any route for the general public would be better than the one proposed. My own opinion is it should start on Court and Liberty streets and run north to Market, and then on Market to Sixth and then either on Sixth through to Highland avenue or the Fair Grounds road to the fair grounds. It could be built cheaper and better out the Fair Grounds road than any other way, as that has a solid rock bottom about three feet deep. Gravel has been put in there for the last fifty years, and a six-inch dressing of crushed rock would make an excellent road.

While we are making an improvement let us make it in the interest of the general public.

We were informed at our league meeting that one of the committee said they (the committee) did not want the boulevard built where the farmers could use it, as they would be hauling wood and manure over it and spoil the road for speeding. I want the boulevard built, and I think Fifth ward agrees with me, so the farmers can travel on it and haul a load of anything they may wish to bring to town or take out. And as Fifth ward will have to help pay for the building, it would be well to consult its interests and let us all work together in harmony for the best interests of Salem in general. E. C. MINTON.
