Those who fail to see Dan Sully and Miss Earl in "The Matchmaker" will surely have cause for lifelong regret, for they go to the heart and mind, and soul, all at once.

CUBANS MAY FIGHT BULLS AND COCKS

(United Press Leased Wire.) Havana, Cuba, March 16.—Although legislation of the Cuban congress is moving slowly, the lack of noteworthy achievement is attributed by politicians discussing the matter today to the fact that Cuba wishes to avoid giving cause for a second intervention by the United States. There is a slight fear that over-cautiousness may result in the very thing the Cubans wish to avoid, as lack of proper legislation will be taken by the United States to indicate lack of capacity, as much as a preponderance of improper lawgiving.

The bill that is expected to arouse adverse comment at Washington is a measure to rescind the military orders against bull fighting and game cock matches. Another feature is the introduction of petty bills which have the most trivial purpose in view.

THE ROAD TO GLORY HARD TO TRAVEL

Bellingham, Wash., March 16.—Rather than lose an \$8000 water main contract, on which he was the lowest bidder, but which had not been awarded him because of his position, J. L. Likens, a local contractor, has resigned as a member of the Bellingham civil service commission. Commissioner Likens' resignation was accepted, and the contract awarded to Citizen Likens. The position of civil service commissioner carries no emolument except the honor, and Likens lost no time in making his selection between glory and real money.

NEW LIGHT FOR HIGH AND MISSION STREETS

At the city council meeting last night Alderman Stockton of the committee on lighting reported favorably on an are light for High and Mission streets. Inquiry as to a light on Fairmount park revealed the fact that this was the last light provided for in the budget. Inquiry as to the lights ordered maintained by the street car company at the ends of lines where there are waiting rooms elicited no information.
