### ONTARIO EXPECTS BIG DELEGATIONS

Making Big Preparations for Entertainment of Oregon-Idaho Congress.

Extensive preparations are being made by the citizens of Ontario to entertain the delegates to the coming session of the Oregon-Idaho Development congress, to be held here two days, March 26-27. An excellent program is being planned and the congress promises to be one of the biggest and best meetings ever held in this part of the state.

The Oregon-Idaho congress, which has for the past four months been holding packed sessions in the various towns of the two states, and which has awakened universal interest in its movement for state-built railroads, is the organization which has for its object, as the name implies, the development of the two states in which it is working. This development is desired in all lines, not only to encourage commercial interest, but to aid irrigation projects, to advance the use of all natural resources and to unite the interest of both states in every way. The particular object which the congress has in view at present is the building of a railroad from Coos Bay, Or., across the state to Ontario, and thence to Boise. The plan advanced by the congress for the building of this road is the plan recently approved by the legislatures of Oregon and Idaho, to issue bonds on the credit of the people, by forming railroad districts, similar to the well known irrigation districts, and issuing the bonds on the credit of the districts or of counties through which the railroads will pass.

This plan has received the recommendation and enthusiastic approval of the most prominent men in both Oregon and Idaho. Twenty of the leading citizens of Portland went to Salem during the session of the Oregon legislature to urge the adoption of laws enabling the people to put this plan in operation. Governor Chamberlain sent a message to the legislature urging adoption of such laws. They were adopted. Similarly in Idaho the measure was supported by many leading men of the state, and Governor Brady urged the legislature to adopt it. It was adopted.

The Oregon-Idaho congress is doing everything possible to aid in the realization of this object. At the meeting in Ontario some of the most prominent speakers in both states will present the subject from various viewpoints. Delegates from Coos Bay will tell of the wonderful undeveloped resources of that country, and the finest natural harbor on the western coast of North America. Others from interior Oregon will tell of the vast undeveloped region tied up inside Harriman's belt of steel and Idaho men will tell of Idaho's needs and hopes for railroad building.

Hon. Stephen A. Lowell of Pendleton, president of the congress, will preside at the meeting, and will explain the work and purpose of the organization.

Colonel E. Hofer, editor of the Salem Capital Journal and vice president of the congress, will speak. Col. C. E. S. Wood and Hon. J. N. Teal, president of the Columbia Open River

association, will both appear on the program. Judge J. H. Richards of Boise, Walter Griffiths of Caldwell, and Colonel L. V. Patch of Payette all will speak.

The first day of the congress will be exclusively devoted to the railroad program. The second day, Saturday, will have a local interest for Idaho and eastern Oregon in that it will also emphasize the Malheur government irrigation project. The principal towns of Malheur county, Oregon, and several towns of Canyon county, Idaho, are situated in the heart of this immense project, which will water 200,000 acres of the finest land in the Snake river country, and which has for several months been the all-absorbing topic of interest in this entire section. This project is practically assured, and will develop a stretch of country as rich in varied resources as any developed portion of either state.

The recent discovery of unlimited quantities of gas at Ontario has already made this town a great center of interest throughout the northwest. Discovery of rich coal beds in the county are also attracting much interest from the outside world.

The inrush of strangers from all parts of the country to this town has created a great demand for hotel accommodations, but the large delegation to the Oregon-Idaho congress will be taken care of in the most thorough manner by the town people. Homes will be thrown open all over the town and every arrangement has been made to make visitors comfortable. The town expects to entertain 500 visitors at the time of this meeting and it can do so in a thoroughly hospitable manner.
