

RESERVE RAISES CROP OF WILDCATS

[United Press Leased Wire.] Tacoma, Wash., March 17.—The woods are full of wild cats in the neighborhood of Ashford, in the upper Nisqually river valley, and considerable loss of livestock is reported by ranchers as a result of the depredations of the big cats.

The protection of game in the Rainier forestry reserve, which is but a few miles distant from Ashford, affords feeding grounds for the animals, with no danger of being hunted, save when they get outside the reserve.
