FIFTH WARD WIDE AWAKE

Fifth ward held its regular meeting last night and more interest than ever was manifested. The street committee reported that it had seen nearly all property-holders along Broadway and only two made objections to its improvement.

On motion, properly seconded, it was resolved that the proper steps should at once be taken to improve Broadway from Mill creek north to Highland avenue, by bringing the street to the original Tillman grade, and macadamize by having six inches of gravel thoroughly rolled and a top dressing three inches thick of crushed rock; also that Hood and Market streets be each improved in the same manner, at least for two blocks on each side of Broadway. The boulevard to the fair grounds was then discussed, and on motion of Councilman Hill it was resolved that it should be built, commencing at Court and Liberty streets, thence north to Broadway, and on Broadway to Market; on Market to Sixth, on Sixth to the Fair Ground road, and following the Fair Ground road to the fair grounds. A committee of three, Hueckstein, Boise and Minton, was appointed to present the matter to the city council.

It was the unanimous opinion of the league that Salem should have mountain water if it was not too expensive for the city to get it.
