AFFAIRS
AT FAIR
ARE FAIR

The first dressing is now being put on the Lone Oak race track at the state fair grounds, preparatory to the coming racing season, and it is thought by the first of April that training will commence.

The Lone Oak track withstood the severe winter in good shape, and no extra work will be necessary to put it in good condition. The drainage on this track is conceded to be the best of any track on the coast, and a few days of sunshine dries all the wet spots up quickly.

So far there have been no shipments of racing stock to this track for training, but they are expected to arrive in bunches before long. The fair officials have been keeping their eyes on the racing material in California this winter, and the program for the Oregon state fair this season will be composed of A No. 1 harness horses and running horses. Harness racing will be, as usual, the popular form of racing on the circuit, although running stock will be accepted to meet the requirements of all fairs, whose attendants are not entirely partial to harness races.

The running program last season was soon filled, and for this reason there is no difficulty predicted in securing the same number this season. Owing to Salem being on the general Pacific coast racing circuit, other entries will probably be on hand, and the assurance is given by the fair officers for a good speedy collection of events, is gratifying to the lovers of the racing sport. Several communications have been received from racing promoters to the effect that they were desirous of getting in on the six-day meet, and the larger portion of these men had racing stock on the Lone Oak track last year.

The training quarters for the horses and men will be open to use within a short time, they all having been thoroughly renovated and put in first-class condition. The barns last season were hardly adequate to accommodate the many entries which applied late, but this will be remedied this year.
