BREAKING DAMS
CAUSE GREAT LOSS

[United Press Leased Wire.]
Parkersburg, W. Va., March 19.—With a thunderous roar two huge water reservoirs above this city burst today and overwhelmed 40 houses, fatally injuring four persons and seriously injuring many others in the wreckage.

One man was reported missing when the rescuers began their work. That more were not killed was due to the noise made by the surging flood, which enabled many families to flee to higher ground.

Shortly after the waters inundated the buildings in their path an investigation by officials disclosed what are believed to be evidences of the use of dynamite on the water tanks.

The contents of the reservoirs was lost entirely and the city faces a serious water famine. The entire supply of the city was held in the tanks.

The fire department would be helpless in case of a blaze and the board of health is taking steps to prevent the possibility of an epidemic because of lack of water to flush the sewers.

When the flood struck a row of houses in its path they collapsed like a pack of cards. Scores of persons were injured by falling beams, timbers and brick. Mrs. John Maloney, who is reported dying, was carried 50 yards on floating wreckage. Both her legs were broken and she was injured internally.

The best estimate of the damage done by the flood is \$300,000.

Parkersburg, W. Va., March 19.—The bodies of three persons were recovered from the wreckage of 40 houses which were overwhelmed this morning by the bursting of two large reservoirs above the city. Four persons were fatally injured, while many others sustained injuries which, though serious, will not prove fatal. The flooded ruins are being searched, and it is expected that more bodies will be found.

IGNATIUS SHOULD
BE PRESIDENT

Chicago, Ill., March 19.—Attorneys for J. Ignatius Finnigan, a St. Louis newspaperman, are reported today to be preparing the necessary legal papers to compel Battling Nelson, the lightweight champion, to make an accounting of the proceeds of the book "Life, Battles and Career of Battling Nelson."

Finnigan claims that he, and not the fighter, is the author of the book, and that he and Nelson were partners in the exploitation of the Dane's autobiography. This Nelson denied. He declares that Finnigan acted as his stenographer and typewriter, and that while Finnigan wrote the book on the machine, he did not originate it. Nelson says every sentence in the book was framed by himself.

Eggs When the Price Is High.
To get plenty of eggs in winter the experts recommend that the hens be forced to molt during midsummer. To do this a writer in the Reliable Poultry Journal gives the following method:

"During June I feed oats and wheat. At first I give them the usual quantity, gradually reducing it until I feed a floc of twenty hens only about one pint of oats and wheat mixed, three times a day. This is plenty for this size of pen of utility fowls. Scatter the wheat and oats in litter of some kind. Keep the birds on that ration until about the 4th of July and then gradually increase until you get them back to the regular feed, which is about a handful for each one of wheat, oats, Kaffir-corn, barley or buckwheat. About three mornings in the week feed mash of cornmeal, wheat, bran, short-cut middlings and linseed meal using about equal parts of each. Allow about one quart of the mixture to twenty hens. A little salt, less than a teaspoonful, and a little black pepper should be added to the mash, and it should be wet only enough so that it will crumble when you throw it into a trough or on a board. Never feed mash on the ground or in dirt. See that the troughs are cleaned after each feeding. Two or three times a week feed them cut bone or beef scrap and give them plenty of green food such as blue grass, clover or cabbage. In winter time clover hay or alfalfa is a fine substitute for cabbage. If you force your utility hens to molt early, you will be sure of a good supply of eggs in the winter when prices are high."—Ex.
