HARRIMAN ROAD TO CENTRAL OREGON

[United Press Leased Wire.]

Washington, D. C., March 22.—An other move looking to the establishment by Harriman of a railroad through Central Oregon will be made immediately by the departure of Supervising Engineer D. C. Henny, of the reclamation service, for Oregon to consult with the railroad magnate's engineers in that state.

The principal question to be discussed at this time concerns the establishment of the right of way through the Deschutes canyon, the proposed course of the line. Because of Henny's familiarity with that country he has been selected to adjust the matter. It is said there is some doubt whether the Harriman engineers will agree to the plans of the government.

ALDERMEN VISITED QUARRY

WANT CHEAPER ROAD MATERIAL

Aldermen Stolz, Stockton, Greenbaum and Moffett and Messrs. H. C. Pohle, J. M. Martin and Mr. Winstanley of Beall & Co., Portland, went out in rigs to visit the Croisan rock quarry this morning. Mr. Stockton drove his own team but the rest went in one of Alderman Low's fine livery rigs. The party visited the land which is understood to be for sale, 40 acres at \$100 per acre, and which has rock enough on it to pave all the streets in the city and then some. It was a jolly party, interested in securing a supply of road material at lower rates. Mr. Pohle and Mr. Martin represented the Court street people, who are also solicitous to secure cheaper street paving material. A fine crushed rock road has been built to the Croisan land and the committee found it all down grade from the quarry to the city, so that big loads can be hauled. It is believed that a great deal more paving will be done if the price of the road metal can be lowered, and Mr. Pohle goes so far as to say he believes it would pay the city to furnish the
