WHITE GIRL STICKS TO HER JAP LOVER

San Francisco, March 24.—Unrestrained by public opinion, which strongly condemns what it believes a mesalliance, Helen Gladys Emery, the young daughter of Archdeacon John Emery, of the Episcopal diocese of California, aided and abetted by her mother, is preparing today to evade the law of the state by marrying Gungiro Aoki outside California, according to a rumor extant here today.

Undeterred by the objections of her father and her friends, Miss Emery and her mother are packing their trunks preparatory to a flight from the jurisdiction of the California statutes, where the girl may become the bride of the Japanese dishwasher, whose soul, according to Miss Emery, is white, though his skin is brown.

"It is un-Christian to object to the marriage because of difference in race," are the quoted words of Mrs. Emery.

"Christianity teaches us all our souls are white."

Mrs. Emery's theory as to the soul color of the Japanese sultor of her daughter, is not borne out by the remarks of Aoki's relatives and Japanese friends, who are reported to have offered him \$1000 to forsake his plan to marry the white girl. These friends and kin declare that Aoki's astral raiment is not spotless; rather that he is a Japanese Don Juan of no mean reputation. They aver that he has successfully invaded and riven the homes of several Japanese gents, and that it is not the first time he has practiced his wiles on the heart of a Caucasian of the gentle persuasion.

Gungiro, unheeding the pleas of his brother, the Rev. Aoki, who has been politely—always politely—asked to resign his pastorate of the Japanese mission, has indignantly spurned the preferred "thou" of his compatriots, and refused to relinquish his claim to Miss Emery.

The family of Emerys, however, is seriously divided, and the woman's continued defiance of the world's disapproval may result in the breaking up of the household.

Recently Mrs. Emery sent a message to her son, Charles, asking him how he viewed the approaching nuptials of Aoki and his sister.

The answer was succinct and to the point. It read:

"Dear Mother: You know how I love a 'nigger.'"

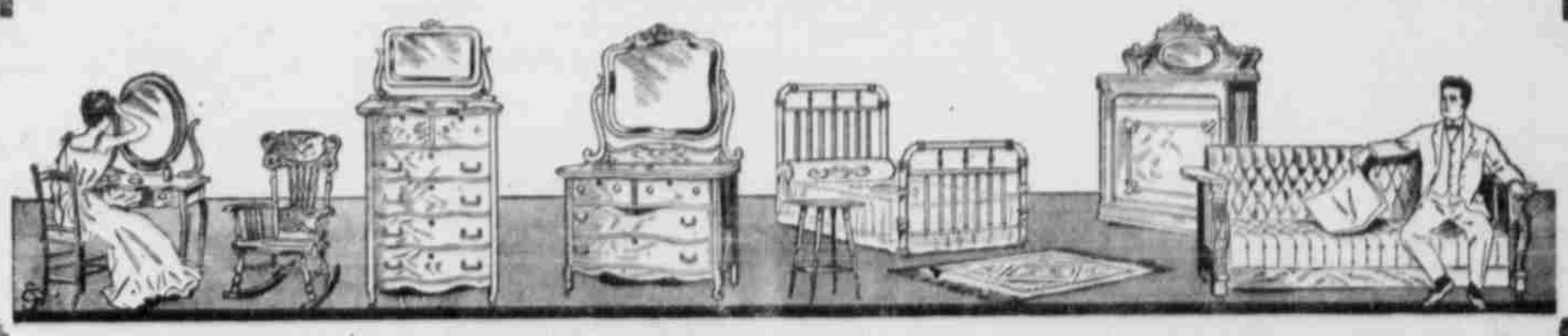
