DEVELOPMENT CONGRESS FAVORS STATE AIDED ROAD

Ontario, Or., March 27.—The Oregon-Idaho Development congress which is in session here, will go on record as favoring state or district owned railroads. This is evidenced by the enthusiasm displayed at today's meeting, the delegates loudly cheering the speakers who advocated such a project.

Frank Davey of Burns, Or., one of those who addressed the congress, declared:

"It is our plain duty to build this railroad across the state of Oregon, opening up the great inland empire."

Reilly Atkinson, secretary of the Boise Commercial club, prophesied that if the project is put through the road would be extended to Butte, Mont., and connect with the transcontinental lines.

E. H. Helgh, president and general

manager of the Pacific and Idaho Northern, a local railroad running from Welser to Evergreen, Idaho, said the district railroad plan was entirely feasible and pledged his support.
