## TO KEEP JULY FOURTH

SENTIMENT SAYS, "OF COURSE"

Shall Salem celebrate the Fourth or not? This is the question that is now being considered by many of the Salem business men. It has been definitely decided by the Board of Trade committee on amusements to postpone the national holiday celebration until the date of the coming cherry fair, at which time a rousing good time and celebration will be indulged in by all Salem, but on the other hand inasmuch as the Board of Trade has forwarded a good suggestion, several business men and parties who have taken considerable part in the assistance of holiday celebrations in this city, are of the opinion that the Fourth should not be passed by, and that a fitting program should be arranged, fireworks procured for the occasion and an all around celebration had. The grounds upon which they place their urgent desires is that a city like Salem should keep abreast with the times on such occasions as the Fourth and other national affairs in the same manner other cities are accustomed to doing; in other words, Salem is in duty bound to keep up the good work of advancement by keeping up all such customs.

In speaking with a prominent business man of the city today he said that notwithstanding the fact the cherry fair was the greatest boasting move that Salem could have originated, yet to fittingly celebrate the Fourth would not only tend to impress outsiders to regard to the liveliness of the city but expectations are being entertained by most every small town within reasonable dis-

tance for Salem for a rousing Fourth of July celebration, and this means that the visitors who will come to Salem on such an occasion and go home again after having a first-class time, will not be backward in praising a good word about for the city that is "there with the merry."

It has also been suggested that a celebration of the Fourth could be held and in no way hinder the holding of a good cherry fair afterward. When people attend a Fourth of July celebration they are accustomed to "having a time," but when a cherry fair is held a larger per cent of the attendance come to see and learn.
