PRESENCE OF MIND SAVES HIS LIFE

[United Press Leased Wire.] Port Townsend, Wash., March 29.—Fireman Horohan of the United States Coast artillery corps at Fort Worden is alive to-day only because of rare presence of mind in face of great danger, saved him from death and frightful mutilation. Horohan had been detailed to handle a donkey engine with the aid of which coal for the post was being hauled to a high eminence from the quarter-master dock. The heavy machinery was in motion when the sleeve of Horohan's blouse caught in the wire cable winding a monster drum. Twice the map was whirled around the drum, the reeling strands gradually drawing him to destruction when by superhuman effort as he was hurled around, Horohan kicked the steam valve with such violence that the machinery was stopped. Fellow soldiers found Horohan suspended high in the air and unable to extricate himself. At his direction the gear was reversed and the cable unwound until he could be lifted down. A few more revolutions of the drum would have drawn Horohan under the steel coils which would have cut his body to pieces.
