It will be the greatest source of pride to this city to get an unpollutable supply of mountain water.

The water of a Capital City, the seat of a state government should be like Caesar's wife, ABOVE SUSPICION.

It should not only be pure, but beyond the danger of pollution from any source whatever.

Eastern cities are to be further safeguarded by legislation to SURROUND THEIR WATER SUPPLY WITH EVERY PROTECTION.

A bill before the Pennsylvania legislature authorizes cities to purchase forest tracts at the head of water sheds.

The time will come when this will be necessary for the city of Salem, TO PRESERVE INTACT THE PURITY OF ITS WATER SUPPLY.

The present plan is for the city to go to the forest reserve for an uncontaminated supply of mountain water.

That problem solved, the real progress of this city will begin, and the construction of houses WILL PASS THE THOUSAND MARK IN ONE YEAR.

The only danger now is that the city will not put in a supply system large enough to meet the demands of a city of fifty thousand people.

NO ONE SHOULD ENVY A LARGE MANUFACTURER.

Some persons, without thinking, envy the head of a large establishment, like the Spaulding Lumber Company.

A CONVENTION OF THE FOUR HUNDRED.

The Republican city committee of Portland will try the experiment of suggesting names to be submitted to a primary election.

As is well known, the Direct Primary law abolishing nominating conventions TO SELECT PARTY CANDIDATES.

To get around this the Republican city committee will

name four hundred representative Republicans by wards to name a ticket.

This ticket will be placed before the voters at the Primary election for ratification BY THE MEMBERS OF THE PARTY.

As four hundred and one will be a majority of the four hundred, the ticket thus ratified would be the choice of a very small number.

That it would restore machine politics is perfectly plain on the face of the matter, and THE CHOICE OF SUCH A MACHINE WOULD BE DEFEATED.

Besides it is principally aimed at the overthrow of the Direct Primary law, because if the "Suggestion" plan will work in city it will in state.

Suggestions from the four hundred will be not a whit more apt to embody political wisdom, THAN SUGGESTIONS FROM THE FOUR THOUSAND.

Finally the forty thousand voters of the city of Portland will have to pass on the matter of a city ticket.

That Fair Grounds Boulevard is a thing not lightly to be cast aside by this city. It would seem as if the street committee and the mayor and the whole city council should exhaust the last resource of municipal authority to pull off that improvement so vital to keeping the state fair at the Capital City.

SELLS HIS RACERS AND QUITS THE TRACK

San Francisco, April 1.—Thomas H. Williams, president of the new California Jockey Club, has issued orders to his trainer, Dr. H. E. Rowell, to sell all his race horses, except a few which are to be saved as presents to friends.

Following the enactment of an anti-racetrack law by the last legislature, this decision on the part of the California's turf king, has been taken as a practical announcement of his retirement from the racing game. This is denied by Williams, who explains that he has no intention of quitting the turf, but that, on account of the pressing demands of his other interests, Mexican mines and slaughtering privileges, he must divert his attention from Emeryville for a time.

Williams has bought horses extensively, but his investments have never brought him any of the heavy purses offered on his own or other tracks. At best, his stable netted him hardly \$20,000 last year.

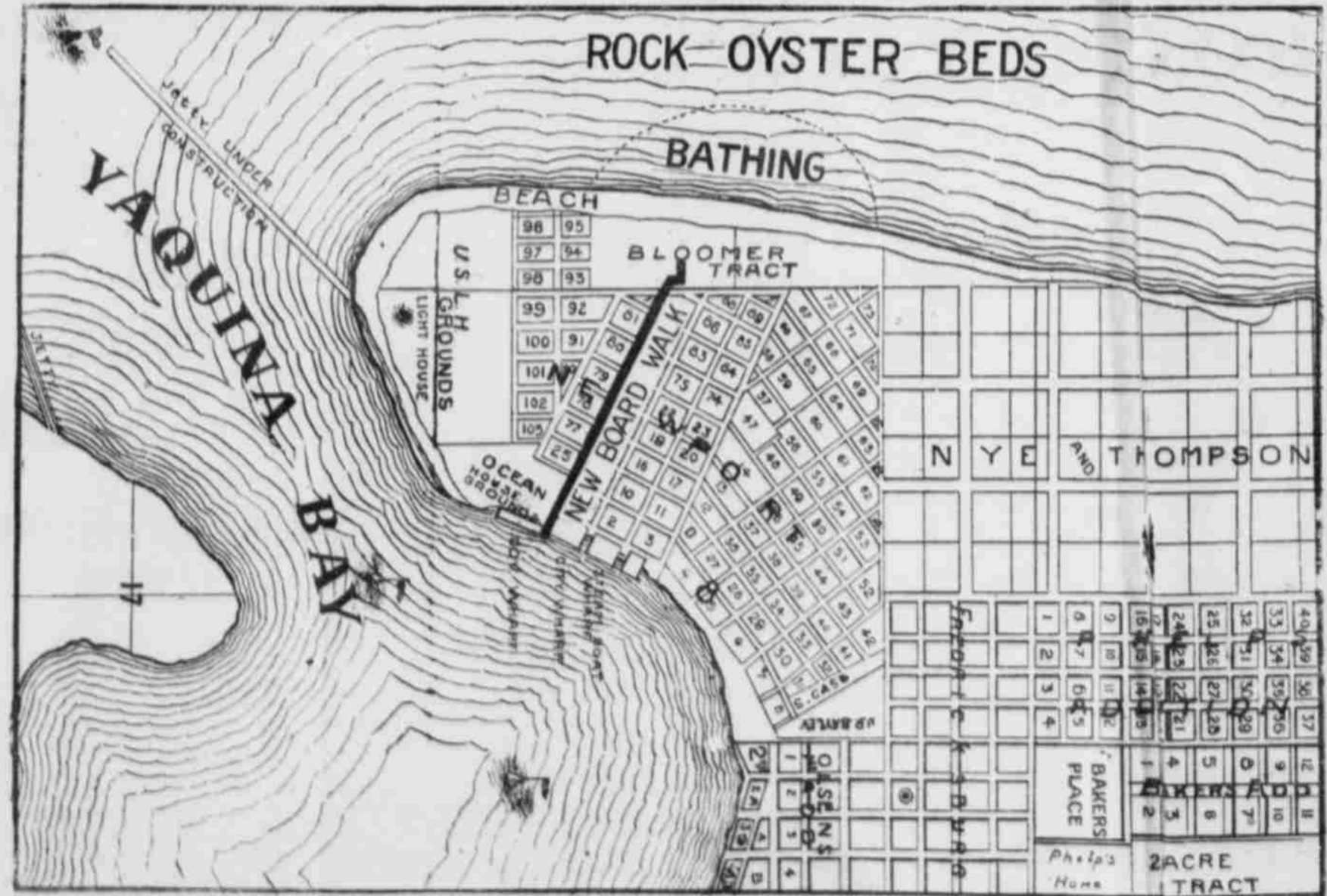
