JAPAN'S FAMOUS TEMPLE BURNED

Tokio, April 1.—The historic Tugawa Shogunates temple, the most famous edifice in Japan, was totally destroyed by fire this morning. The loss is estimated at \$3,000,000.

Though most of the priceless art and historic treasures were saved the destruction of the ancient structure, which has linked modern Japan with the feudal days of the warring shoguns, is looked upon as a national disaster.

The temple of the shoguns was situated in the Zojoji district of Tokyo, and has been the last one which has attracted many students and travelers to Japan.

The marvelous craftsmanship, now a lost art among the Japanese, which was displayed in the stone carvings and interior decorations of the imposing edifice, makes its rebuilding impossible.

ESCAPED CONVICTS CAPTURED TODAY

San Francisco, April 1.—Convicts Alexander Hagan and Michael McKenna, who escaped from Folsom prison last Monday, were caught this morning in this city just as they stepped off a Sacramento river boat. They will be promptly returned to the penitentiary.

The two convicts, both serving long terms for robbery, eluded the guards at the prison three days ago, crossing the American river by swinging hand over hand on a guy rope. They made a successful dash toward the hills and the posse seemed unable to find any trace of them.

The information that the fugitives had slipped to a river point and taken a boat to this city was kept a secret, and the convicts were much surprised when they found the police officers awaiting their arrival this morning.

After their arrest this morning the two convicts talked freely about their experience of the last few days. They said that they had decided to escape by river to this city after they had nearly lost their lives trying to dodge the bloodhounds, which were put on their trail in Sacramento county.

Near Orangeville the dogs caught up with them, and attacked them. A desperate battle ensued. One of the hounds sprang at McKenna's neck and buried his teeth in the lapel of his victim's coat. Hagan says that the dog would have downed McKenna and killed him had he not jumped to the rescue and slashed the dog's throat with a knife which he had.

The men made their way stealthily into Sacramento and stowed away on the river boat Modoc. They were recognized by First Mate Donovan, who, however, made no commotion, merely notifying Captain Rideout, who, when he reached the dock, notified the officers at the harbor police station by a series of whistle signals. The police boarded the boat at the wharf, and, after searching, found the two convicts hiding behind a pile of freight on the lower deck.

A BIG CORPORATION TAKES GREAT PROPERTIES

Galveston, Tex., April 1.—A new syndicate, with a capital of \$40,000,000 will take over the properties of Colonel W. C. Greene, with the single exception of the latter's famous ranch in Mexico. This is the gist of a statement given out by Greene himself, who is now at El Paso, recuperating after a serious illness. In the new corporation are a number of wealthy Americans, as well as capitalists from Mexico and Canada.

Besides receiving mining in La Canales, in Sonora, Mexico, the syndicate will open up large tracts of valuable timber and will extend the railroad from Ferrans to Guaymas, on the Pacific, 240 miles, thus giving direct rail facilities across Northern Mexico from El Paso to the ports on the Pacific.

Pacific University, Forest Grove, Or., April 1.—Miss Helen Abbott, teacher in the academy department and a resident of the ladies' dormitory, was the victim of an April fool joke, perpetrated, it is said, by members of her classes, who also live in the hall. While on the way to breakfast this morning, one of the professors picked up a note dropped from an upstairs window of the building announcing the imprisonment of Miss Abbott in her room on the third floor.

The inmates of the dormitory were questioned by the mistress in charge, but neither information or key could be obtained. After every possible means was tried she was finally liberated.

Miss Abbott's classes in the academy recited this morning to Miss Mary F. Farnham, the dean of women. They were much chagrined as they had hoped by placing their in captivity to gain a holiday.

The school authorities are expected to conduct a thorough investigation of the affair.

OLD GLORY COMES DOWN LONE STAR FLAG GOES UP

[United Press Leased Wire.] Havana, Cuba, April 1.—The Stars and Stripes have disappeared from Cuba. The last emblem of American dominion has been removed in due order, and the lone starred red banner of the emancipation is now floating in its place.

Yesterday, at the direction of Major-General Thomas J. Barry, the Twenty-Seventh Infantry, U. S. A., evacuated Camp Columbia. The ceremony of hauling down the American flag and replacing it with the Cuban colors was witnessed by troops of both nations, the "Star Spangled Banner" and the "Hymn De Bayamo" being played by the respective bands before the Yankee regulars marched away.

BANK ROBBER ROBBED HIS PALS

[United Press Leased Wire.] Los Angeles, Cal., April 1.—The five men imprisoned here on charges of burglarizing the First National Bank of Monrovia and stealing \$29,700 have confessed that in dividing the loot they, in turn, were robbed by a sixth member of the gang, who snatched them by a clever piece of sleight of hand, while bills of large denominations were being distributed among the thieves.

This mysterious sixth man, for whom the police are now searching, was smart enough, under the eyes of his fellow-crooks, to "shift" several \$500 bills for 50 bills, and he also made away with one of the four registered \$1,000 bills which the bank has reported missing.

Only \$12,000 of the missing booty has thus far been recovered.

The missing member of the gang will be captured in San Francisco today, according to advices received here from Detective Hatter, of the local Pinkerton agency, who believes he has run down the fugitive. The officers expect to find most of the missing money on the person of the man.
