The cream of the joke is that the Grangers in the legislature amended Bailey's \$9000 item in both houses so as to **HAVE THE GOVERNOR APPOINT.**

But a senate engrossing committee kindly omitted the amendment from the bill in its final form, and Bailey gets his \$9000 just the same.

OXFORD WINS RACE FROM CAMBRIDGE

[United Press Leased Wire.] London, April 3.—Upsetting the prediction of the experts, Oxford today finished three and a half lengths ahead of Cambridge in the annual Thames race from Putney to North Lake, a distance of 4 1/4 miles.

Thousands witnessed the spectacle, which was one of the most exciting races in the history of the two universities.

The time was 19 minutes, 50 seconds, which is one minute and three seconds below the record made by Cambridge in 1900.

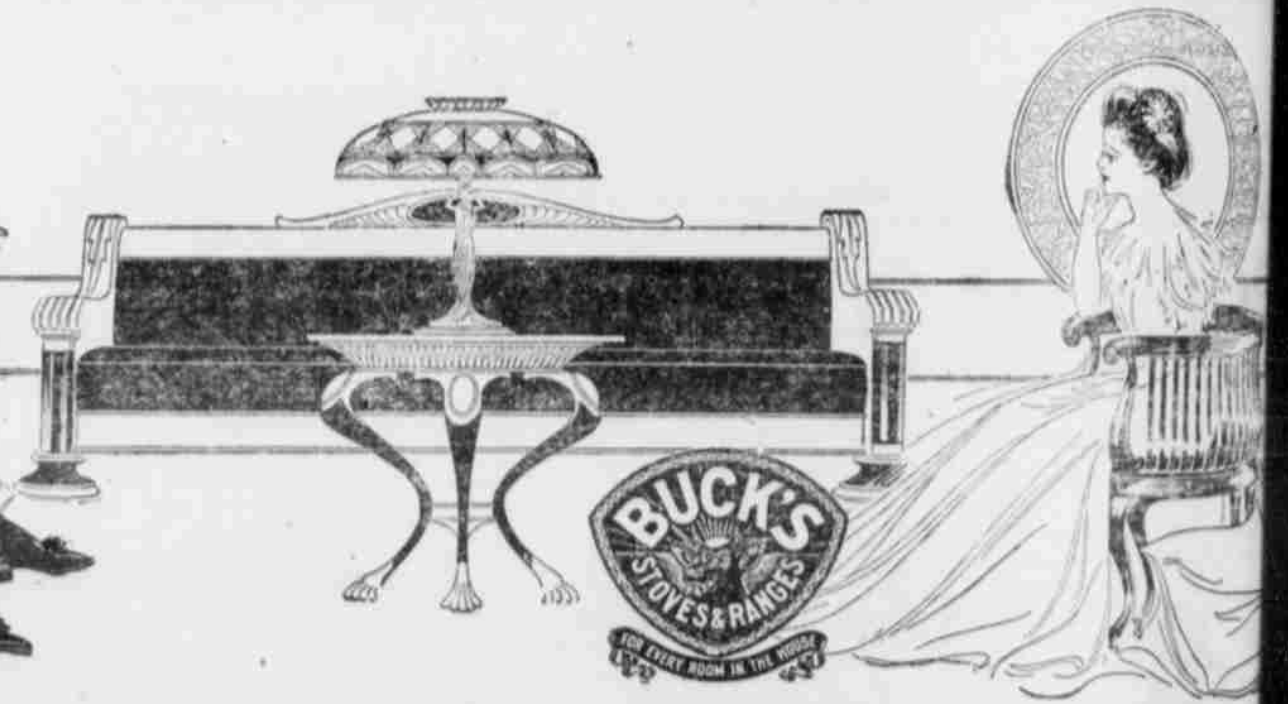
